School Supplies and Classroom Academic Contribution

This year, we tried a new process for school supplies by holding drop off days the week before the first day of school. It was very well received; many parents expressed relief at not having to bring everything in on the first day of school.

Speaking of school supplies, we will soon be sending out a survey inquiring about school supplies while this experience is fresh in your minds. We are considering moving to a donation model to cover all school supplies so that families do not need to go to buy the school supplies. As a school, we can get a bulk discount if we order this way *and* we can order supplies when we need it. Stay tuned for this survey coming out in mid-September.

This school year, your classroom teacher may request a contribution to help pay for supplemental school activities. These requests are called "Classroom Academic Contributions" and they go towards funding activities and supplies that have a direct benefit to students. Examples might be field trip admissions, presentations from outside organizations (Audubon, Mad Science, OMSI, etc.), or Scholastic News. Field Trips at Bridlemile

As part of our ongoing efforts to provide enriching learning experiences, we are continuing our collaborative efforts for the upcoming academic year. We understand the significance of experiential and instructive field trips in enhancing our students' understanding of grade-level content.



Our grade level teams will be organizing 1-2 field trips together so

that every student at each grade level has the opportunity to benefit from hands-on learning experiences aligned with our curriculum. This year, the exception is Grade 4, who will have three field trips because they have the additional field trip opportunity with Salmon in the Classroom. Studying the salmon life cycle is part of 4th grade science curriculum. As part of the program with U.S. Fish and Wildlife, Bridlemile will be hosting a salmon tank, which we will house in the main lobby so that all Beagles will have the opportunity to watch our salmon grow from egg, alevin, fry, parr, smolt, to adult.

After each field trip, we will reflect on its impact on student learning and make improvements for future memorable experiences.

From the Bridlemile Health Room

From Nurse Trudy Davis:

If your child will need to take medicine during the school day, please check it in with our School Health Assistant (SHA) C.J. Bakken. This includes both prescription and over the counter medication (including cough drops).

All medication must be in its original packaging/container, the prescription label must be clear on the package and medication must also be brought to school by an adult.

New Covid-19 Policy for 2023-24:

Starting school year 2023-24, Covid-19 is no longer an excludable/reportable disease. This means that if a student or adult in your family tests positive on a Covid-19 test, they will no longer be excluded from school if they are fever free for 24 hours and symptoms are improving. More information is listed below:

- Refer to the OHA <u>Symptom-Based Exclusion Chart</u>. Student may return to school after being fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication AND other symptoms are improving for at least 24 hours.
- Student should be encouraged to wear a mask for 10 days after they develop symptoms or test positive.
- Notification to cohort or school community is not required.

Effective June 17, 2023, the COVID-19 vaccination requirement for public and private school teachers, staff and school volunteers and contractors (OAR 333-019-1030) is lifted.

The use of masks will remain optional for students, staff, volunteers, and visitors. Schools will continue to have a supply of masks for students/staff to access.

Staff and students will follow the <u>Symptom-Based Exclusion Chart</u> and the <u>Communicable Disease</u> <u>Guidance</u> to know when to keep students home due to excludable symptoms or a schoolrestrictable disease.

Please follow these guidelines to help all students stay healthy and ready to learn.
