## \*IB Diploma Requirements

\* Creativity, Action and Service (CAS)

\* 18 months of experiences logged into ManageBac

\* Reflections on experiences

\* CAS project

\* Evidence of growth in 7 learning outcomes

\* Theory of Knowledge (TOK)

\* IB assessment includes required TOK essay

\* Class at Lincoln - juniors in the spring and seniors in the fall

\* Extended Essay

\* Inquiry project outside of class

\* Supervised by a Lincoln teacher

# \*IB Riploma Core

- \*72 out of 73 candidates earned the IB Diploma
   \*Average subject score for diploma students = 5.11 out of 7
- \*Average total score for diploma students = 33 out of 45
- \*Majority of students earn a 4 or higher on exams

### \*The Value of an IB Education

- \*IB students are less concerned with grades in college
- \*IB students can connect content across disciplines
- \*IB students can take multiple perspectives on the same issues and revise their position
- \*IB students are academically adjusted as soon as they set foot on campus

## \*IB and college readiness

\*The average acceptance rate of IB students into university is **22% higher** than the total population

\*The acceptance rate of IB students into Ivy League institutions is between **3% and 13% higher** compared to the total population

\*Every student should test in every course\*

## \*Oregon University System IB Policy

\*Exams are taken at the end of the course

- \*Juniors may sit for a maximum of 2 SL exams towards their diploma
- \* Only seniors may register for HL exams
- \* Deadline for registration is Oct. 31
- \*Exam dates and times are set by the IBO and <u>cannot</u> be changed. No "late" exams.
- \*Students register using *Naviance*
- \*Instructions on the Lincoln IB website

\* Partial refunds of exam fees from Nov 15-Jan 15
 \* No refunds after January 15
 \* Late fees for changes/registration after Nov 15
 \* Fees waived for students who qualify for the federal Free and Reduced Lunch program

## \*May 2017 Exam Fee Policies

\*80% of score from externally assessed material \*20% of score from internally assessed material

- \* Work completed at the school
- $^{\ast}$  Work assessed by the teacher using an IB rubric
- \* Scores sent to IB
- \* Scores moderated by IB using student sample work
- \* Scores due to IB in April
