Weather + Erosion + Forensics = Fun in Science

The 8th grade Earth Science students will finish their unit on Weather and Atmosphere focusing on Extreme Weather...tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, and droughts in Portland and the world. What causes and effects on the environment and people? What can we do to prepare for this possibility? ARE YOU PREPARED? DO YOU HAVE A PLAN? The students will finally design and build weather instruments and test their functionality indoors and outdoors.

The 7th grade Integrated Science students will be finishing their unit on Erosion & Weathering by studying the impact of erosion and flooding in Oregon and Boomtown. They will write a Geologist's Report giving their recommendation for where to build in the fictional town of Boomtown based on evidence related to geology, topography, and erosion.

The 7/8 Advanced Science students are continuing their studies on Forensic Anthropology and we can use bones, skeletons, height, and teeth to identify possible victims and people. We just finished identifying and constructing a rodent skeleton and will finish with the "Facial Reconstruction" of a person using clay, hair, and a wighead and of course determine what caused their head trauma.
