A Note from Ms. Ragaisis,

As a part of Portland Public Schools, James John Elementary embraces a shared goal that students are prepared for success at the next level. Our objective is that every student, by name, meets or exceeds academic standards and is fully prepared for college, career and participation as an active citizen.

Three checkpoints occur during the K-5th grade school years. The first is that students enter first grade with the skills and habits to be ready to read. The second also relates to reading. We expect that, by the end of third grade, all students will be able to read to learn, to gather information from the reading material and to be able to understand and apply that knowledge. Lastly, the fourth and fifth grade years build on those skills and help prepare students for middle school.

Although our teachers and other staff are committed to working hard to provide quality, challenging instruction, we can't do it alone. Your support is necessary. The first step to success in school is good attendance. We can't teach children who are not here! We have already noticed a few students missing several days of instruction. With around 174 days of school, every day is important in helping each and every child reach those checkpoints.

Regular school attendance is a state requirement and parents are held accountable. When attendance becomes a problem, our staff will communicate directly with you to discuss ways to improve attendance. Letters will be sent, meetings will be required and other resources, such as our School Police Resource Officer and/or the Department of Human Services may be contacted for support. In every instance, our motivation is to help you get your child to school each and every day, ready to learn.

Love, care and concern for your children create an environment where James John students can thrive. With a warm, nurturing and safe school, we can then focus on the serious business of instruction. We are determined to have our students meet and exceed all the checkpoints. Please join us as partners in this work. When our combined efforts help our students, we will celebrate their success together. This is our challenge for the year.
