Jason Lee Staffing Updates

As you may have heard, Portland Public Schools is in the midst of a budget shortfall. There have been cuts to all schools across the district, including Jason Lee. Overall, we had to make 2.5 cuts to our staffing school-wide. Luckily, we have been able to retain so many of the wonderful supports and programs that our students and staff have come to rely upon.

Next year, we will continue to have a full-time counselor, librarian/media specialist, and PE teacher, in addition to a half-time elementary school art teacher and half-time K-8 music teacher. We are also excited to add a quarter-time Spanish teacher into our middle school program.

Although things may change based upon student enrollment, tentatively we are marked to have two sections of every grade level from kindergarten through 8th grade, with the exception of a third section of 3rd grade. The latter is a pivotal benchmark year for our students, and we have seen the importance of having three sections of 3rd grade in the academic outcomes and growth of our

students year-after-year. Our rising 2nd and 5th grade cohorts will see their class sizes increase next year, as these are the areas where we saw reductions in our teaching force.

We will continue to have small group instruction for reading with three reading educational assistants in our elementary school, in addition to two full-time kindergarten educational assistants. Our middle school will see an increased number of electives, as we will return to an A day / B day schedule for the 2017-2018 school year.



Portland Public Schools District Dress Code Policy

The District Dress Code policy applies to all schools in Portland Public Schools grades PK-12, with the exception of schools with a Uniform Dress Code policy.

The responsibility for the dress and grooming of a student rests primarily with the student and his or her parents or guardians.

Allowable Dress & Grooming

- Students must wear clothing including both a shirt with pants or skirt, or the equivalent and shoes.
- Shirts and dresses must have fabric in the front and on the sides.
- Clothing must cover undergarments, waistbands and bra straps excluded.
- Fabric covering all private parts must not be see through.
- Hats and other headwear must allow the face to be visible and not interfere with the line of sight to any student or staff. Hoodies must allow the student face and ears to be visible to staff.
- Clothing must be suitable for all scheduled classroom activities including physical education, science labs, wood shop, and other activities where unique hazards exist.
- Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.

Non-Allowable Dress & Grooming

- Clothing may not depict, advertise or advocate the use of alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other controlled substances.
- Clothing may not depict pornography, nudity or sexual acts.
- Clothing may not use or depict hate speech targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation or any other protected groups.
- · Clothing, including gang identifiers, must not threaten the health or safety of any other student or staff.
- If the student's attire or grooming threatens the health or safety of any other person, then discipline for dress or grooming violations should be consistent with discipline policies for similar violations.

NEW Jason Lee K-8 Uniform Expectations

Jason Lee requires uniforms for students. The code of dress is as follows:



Tops:

(Dark or Light) Gray, Blue, Yellow or White

- \circ Must have long, $\frac{3}{4}$, or short sleeve
- o Polos, dress shirts, blouses, crew neck T-shirts, turtlenecks
- o School Spirit t-shirt OK (available through PTA)
- o Patterned tops (stripes, paisley etc.) in these colors only are permitted.
- o Logos or designs are smaller than a quarter.
- o Tops must cover/conceal undergarments.

Bottoms:

Navy, Gray, Black or Khaki/Tan

- o Slacks, capris, walking shorts, skirts, skorts or skirted-jumpers.
- Must be plain, solid color Twill, corduroy, leggings (under skirt/skort/shorts only)
 No: Jeans (denim: A coarse, twilled cotton fabric, often blue) or sweatpants.

Outwear:

(Dark or Light) Gray, Blue, Yellow or White

Code of Dress for Tops applies to acceptable outwear for both inside and outside of the classroom.

However, Any kind of jacket/coat/cardigan/sweater/hoodie is OK if it meets regular code of dress rules**.

- o May not be disruptive, distracting, display offensive language/symbols, etc.
- School staff may ask student to remove jackets
- Any pullover garment that is worn all day (sweater, sweater vest, sweatshirt) should have an approved uniform top underneath
