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Dear Families and Community of Peninsula Elementary School,

I want to extend a warm welcome to all of you joining our community for the first time, and for those of you returning! This is my 3<sup>nd</sup> year as the Principal of Peninsula and I am honored to be a part of such an outstanding and exemplary school and community.

We have some exciting new changes coming this year as we reboot as an elementary with the addition of STEAM/Tech classes, expanding PE and creating Lit Labs and Maker spaces. We have also moved recess before lunch. We are continuing our work as an AVID Elementary school and a CARE school, all students will start the year with planners provided to them and continue to expand on the skills they need to help them stay organized. The staff is also expanding their work as lifelong learners to model a growth mindset, improve instruction, reduce bullying and build stronger classroom communities.

We will continue to have Studio-to-School with Julie Keefe, Saturday Academy (Late Openings), Saturday and Wednesday Support through BEAM and CMB Mentoring. Campfire has expanded at Peninsula, and is now offering childcare services in the morning as well as the afternoon.
