NEW: WILSON CROSS COUNTRY WINS PIL, HEADS TO STATE

Last Wednesday the "Green Machine" that is Wilson Cross Country had a historic day of racing at the 2015 PIL District Championships. The afternoon started off with our JV Lady Trojans finishing a strong 4th place. The lead

pack of Trojans included Freshmen Annika Sunderstrom, Lizzie Reunert, Emma Halling, Junior Elsa Douglas, and Senior Natalie McKinnon. The future is extremely bright for this group of up-and-comers!

The JV Boys placed 2nd in a very competitive JV division. The "Wolfpack" was led by Senior Xavier Triplett, Juniors Elius Graff, Aidan Manley and Freshman Caden "Kid" Samkutty, all finishing in the top 10.

However, the main events for the afternoon were in the Varsity divisions. At the district championships only the top three placing teams and top ten individuals qualify for the opportunity to compete at the state meet in Eugene, on October 31st.

The Varsity women's team (Grace Heizer, Isabelle Brooks, Ellie Stein, Iris Emerick, Adarha Poasa and Aurora Emmons) ran their hearts out, yet finished in fourth place (by 3 points) behind Lincoln, Grant and Franklin. However, sophomore Grace Heizer ran like the wind and finished 3rd overall, qualifying her for state as an individual and becoming a member of the 2015 PIL all-league team.

The big news of the day was in the Men's division. The Mighty Trojans (Alex Slenning, Nick Slenning, Kian Mitchell, Chris Nussbaum, Caleb Seely, Sam Berhens and Chase Howard) ran a perfect race and shocked their rivals by winning the district championship. This is the first outright district championship for Wilson XC since 1985 and qualifies the team for the state meet. Highlighting the day was Sophomore super star and now district champ Alex Slenning who blew the field and won the race by 12 seconds. Junior power-house Caleb Seely made a huge move in the last 400 meters to finish in 2nd place. Alex, Caleb and senior Chase Howard all earned All-Conference Honors. Now it's on to state!

We would love to have everyone come join us next Saturday (October 31st) at Lane Community College to cheer your Trojans on at the state competition.

NEW: WILSON SPEECH AND DEBATE TEAM WINS AWARDS

On Saturday, October 24, Wilson hosted the state's largest Speech and Debate tournament to date, with over 300 students from 22 schools participating. Wilson speakers participated in the tournament and won several awards. Congratulations to the Dual Interpretation team of Moses Felberg and Amy Rodgers for taking 1st place in their event. Other speakers achieving awards include finalists Hannah Borel (Dramatic Interpretation), the Dual Interpretation team of Hannah Borel and Bryce Snyder, Tatum Bair (After Dinner Speaking), and Fletcher Calcagno (novice Prose Reading, in his first tournament). Speech and Debate is on the road again to Silverton High School for the Fox Invitational on Saturday, November 7.

NEW: IMMUNIZATION UPDATE—NON-MEDICAL EXEMPTIONS

Recent legislation resulting from Senate Bill 895 has resulted in changes to the requirements for non-medical exemptions, formerly known as religious exemptions. Parents of students who claimed a religious exemption status prior to March 1, 2014, and who wish to continue with an exemption, are now required to obtain a medical exemption or a Vaccine Education Certificate (after receiving the required education about immunizations from a health care practitioner or after watching the online vaccine education module). Parents should also complete a new Certificate of Immunization Status form, and mark the vaccines for which they would like an exemption in the exemption section.
