CROSS COUNTRY STATE MEET RESULTS

Wilson Women took 7th place and Francesca Ierulli (25) earned an honorable mention all-state. The men's team finished 6th, with Alex Slenning (3) and Caleb Seely (7) making first team all-state. Congratulations, everyone, on a great season!

WILSON SPEAKERS PLACE 4TH AT SILVERTON

At the largest Speech and Debate tournament to date (34 schools, over 500 individual event and debate entries), Wilson placed 4th in Team Sweepstakes at the Fox Invitational in Silverton last weekend. Every competitor who made it to finals in individual events placed in the top three. Congratulations to the winners: **Ari Lohr** (2nd place novice Impromptu, 1st place novice Radio Commentary), **Amy Sloan** (3rd place Radio Commentary), **Tosca Ruotolo** (2nd place Prose Reading), **Andrew Foran** (2nd place Humorous Interpretation), **Hannah Borel** (2nd place Programmed Oral Interpretation), and the debate teams of **Fletcher Calcagno** and **Moses Felberg** (3rd place Public Forum) and **Elijah Moon** and **William Sweek** (3rd place Parliamentary, securing Proven Excellence qualification for the State Tournament in April). It took an undefeated record in debates to make the semifinal. Some of the debaters will be competing again on November 12 at Sprague Debates in Salem, while the team as a whole is in action again at Clackamas High school in early December.
