Applying for college is super important and equally important is applying for financial aid. The gateway to receiving financial aid from colleges and universities is filing out the FAFSA or ORSAA. If you want to receive a free public education at any of our Community Colleges through the Oregon Promise grant, you must file a FAFSA first! Come to our FAFSA workshop with financial aid advice and planning professional Jennifer Satalino ; sign up in Naviance under college visits. We will help you get started, help with errors and answer all of questions answered. Work on and finish your application at this session! In order to work on the application at school you will need financial information from your parents.
