Wilson High School is excited to offer a new Health elective course this spring. It is called **Nutrition and Wellness** and will be taught by Wilson Health teacher Josh Martin. The goal of this course is to offer students an opportunity to experience issues, information, and skills regarding the foods they eat. In addition to studying nutrition and how food choices affect our health, we will tackle topics such as food safety and food-borne illnesses resulting in students earning their Oregon Food Handler's Safety certification. We will study the merits and draw-backs of different specialized diets. Students will learn about where their food comes from and the importance of fresh, whole food choices over other less healthy options. The class will also learn some basic safety and cooking skills in the kitchen, along with budgeting and

menu planning. There will be hands-on demonstrations and presentations by local professionals in the food and food service industries.

To do all of these things, we need to stock our kitchen labs with new/gently used kitchen equipment.
