# A Message from Coach Olsen

Last Wednesday was a truly historic day for Wilson XC. On a rain-soaked afternoon, Wilson took on not only the best that Mother Nature could dish out, but also one of the toughest PIL fields ever assembled at **PIL District Cross Country Championships.** 

The JV Ladies started the day off by slip-sliding their way to a second place overall finish. The rain and wind couldn't slow our lead pack of JV ladies, including Freshman Adadra Poasa, Shea Sims (So), Isabelle Brooks (Fr) and Grace Heizer (Fr). Based on their showing at the district meet and effort throughout the year, the future is extremely bright for this group of up & coming Lady Trojans!

The mud was really flying as the JV Men's team tore around the course for a second place finish. Juniors Nick Slening, Aiden Nelson, Xavier Triplett and Paul Parodi all battled the unbelievably muddy conditions to finish in the top fifteen overall.

However, the main events for the afternoon were in the highly anticipated Varsity Men's & Women's divisions. At the district championships only the top three placing teams will qualify for the opportunity to compete at the State meet on November  $\mathbf{1}^{\mathrm{st}}$ , in Eugene Or.

Going into this year's meet, the Varsity Men's team (Jack & Chase Howard, Caleb Seeley, Alex Slening, Sam Berhrens, Kian Mitchell & Jase Jacobsen) knew they were going to be in a dog-fight in order to qualify for state. The boy's team executed a perfect race allowing them to finish second overall. The 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish locked them a place in this year's State meet. Senior Jack Howard finished third overall in a time of 16:47 (3.1 miles), which earned him a second consecutive All-PIL recognition.

The Lady Trojans (Olivia Stein, Sydney Brieher, Kendra Zimmerdahl, Dana Nathanson, Iris Emmerick, Aurora Emmons & Kate Schulte) finished 3<sup>rd</sup> overall. By finishing 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Lady Trojans will represent Wilson (for the second year in a row) at the State meet. Highlighting the women's race were Superstar-Sophomore Sydney Brieher (2<sup>nd</sup> overall), Stud-Seniors Olivia Stein (3<sup>rd</sup> place) and Kendra Zimmerdahl (10<sup>th</sup> place). By finishing in the top-seven at Districts, both Olivia and Sydney earned All-League honors.

To put Wednesday's achievement in perspective, according to our records this is the first time that both Men's and Women's Cross Country teams have qualified for the State Championships in the same year.

We would love to have you join us this Saturday, November 1<sup>st</sup> at the State Championship competition.
