12th-Grade Checklist for April

- 1. **Look for decision letters from colleges.** They're coming this month! Be sure to share your acceptances with counselors, parents, and friends!
- 2. **Compare financial aid award letters.** Financial aid award package letters usually arrive shortly after acceptances. Go over these carefully and ask an adult if you have questions.
- 3. **Sign up for and attend Preview Days.** Whether you're deciding between two colleges, or just want to get more familiar with your first choice, make sure you sign up for prospective student weekends/days.
- 4. **Decide where to attend college.** Decision time! Think carefully and critically about the pros and cons for each school—consider size, academics, cost, extracurricular options and more. Many colleges require a confirmation and initial deposit on May 1st.
