Clear Fees Now

Fees can be paid to Ana Curtis, the bookkeeper in room 149 and transcript fees can be paid to Ana Curtis or Sharon Dailey, the counseling secretary. Check with Ana if you're not sure if you owe fees.

12th-Grade Checklist for April

1. **Look for decision letters from colleges.** They're coming this month! Be sure to share your acceptances with counselors, parents, and friends!
2. **Compare financial aid award letters.** Financial aid award package letters usually arrive shortly after acceptances. Go over these carefully and ask an adult if you have questions.
3. **Sign up for and attend Preview Days.** Whether you're deciding between two colleges, or just want to get more familiar with your first choice, make sure you sign up for prospective student weekends/days.
4. **Decide where to attend college.** Decision time! Think carefully and critically about the pros and cons for each school—consider size, academics, cost, extracurricular options and more. Many colleges require a confirmation and initial deposit on May 1st.
