In order to be successful in high school, student attendance should be at least 90%. Data shows us that grades start to suffer if students miss more than two days per month. Wilson Student Parking Reminders

Wilson Students and Parents: Unfortunately, while we understand that students would like to be able to park on the Wilson campus, we do not have enough parking spots for all of our student drivers. Students with a Wilson 2019 Student Parking Pass may park in student parking, if a legal space is available. A student parking pass does not provide a reserved space or guarantee a spot, so please be aware that even with a parking pass students may have to find alternative parking off campus.

Wilson teachers have assigned, reserved spaces marked "Faculty" in yellow paint. An empty staff spot is not a legal parking space for student parking permit-holders. Teachers are sometimes required to come and go during the day and plan to return to their assigned space. Please respect our teachers and **do not park in staff parking.** Students who park in staff spaces will get a parking ticket. All parking tickets must be paid before we will issue prom tickets or graduation tickets.

Students parked in visitor, volunteer and handicapped parking spots will also be ticketed and/or towed. Disabled students, staff and families who have a disabled parking placard are the only ones who may legally park in disabled parking.
