Wilson High School will administer the ACT free of charge to all Juniors on Tuesday, February 28, during the school day. Like the SAT, the ACT exam is a national college-readiness exam. Almost every college uses ACT scores in their admissions process. In addition to the importance for admission, taking the ACT may open the door to scholarships or other financial aid that can make college more affordable. If you plan to find a job after graduation, the ACT results are still useful because they will show whether our schools are helping students learn the skills they need for well-paid jobs. Three-Ball Backers Scholarship Kick Off

It's hoops season! And, it's time to kick off our seventh annual Three-Ball Backers scholarship for the 2016-2017 women's basketball season. This fundraiser allows us to award an outstanding senior women's basketball player with a \$750.00 college scholarship to the college or institution of their choice.

The concept is simple: Each member of the Three-Ball Backers pledges to sponsor the Wilson Women's Varsity Basketball team for each three-point basket made/ scored throughout the 2016-17 season. For example, if you were to pledge \$1 per three-point shot made, and our varsity team scores 35 three-point shots for the entire season (about the average) then that member would be billed \$35. After the season the money is collected and the \$750.00 scholarship is awarded, any remaining funds will be distributed to the Wilson women's youth basketball program to help the development of women's athletics in our area.
