We are excited to announce some of the FUN-draising opportunities coming this fall! These events help raise money to support our students and teachers. **Our first annual trivia night is coming soon! Last year's **Game Night** was such a success we've decided to do it again! Students and parents can enjoy a fun, family evening playing board games, with the chance to purchase your favorites. What does the PTSO do with all of the funds raised during the year?

As many of you know, we are in the final stages of a plan to **improve**

our playground. The asphalt rectangle does support a surprising amount of play as is, but soon there will be an expanded climbing area, swings, outdoor study and meeting areas and eventually a turf soccer field. The great thing is that the plan is modular, so work can be done as there is money available. We are well on our way to implementing the first part, and every dollar we earn helps us get closer.

In addition to funding the playground, money the PTSO earns is also used to **help teachers fund field trips and purchase needed supplies for the classroom.**

There are many ways to get involved in your child's school. A busy work schedule and family life can make it hard to commit to another activity, but one way you can really help, which does not take much time, is to **become a part of the Astor community by joining the PTSO and attending its monthly meetings**. This is a time to learn about what is happening with the school and what vision the faculty and district have for the future of your child's education. Come share your voice in a supportive and receptive environment! **Did we mention childcare is provided?**

What is Scrip?

Scrip is "substitute money" – gift cards and certificates to local and national merchants. The Astor PTSO purchases scrip at a discount and YOU can buy them at face value – a dollar for dollar exchange – and it costs you NOTHING extra.

Why Purchase Scrip?

Using gift cards increases the power of your shopping dollars. Families get the FULL face value of the gift cards they buy PLUS Astor receives a profit! Gift cards make the perfect gift for holidays and birthdays!

There is never a minimum order and using Scrip can help you budget your own money and plan ahead.

The profit (2-41%) is used to fund our programs and other Astor school needs. The discount adds up quickly - In one week, the benefit to Astor can be HUGE! Last year with those participating, the Astor PTSO raised **over \$4,200** with this fundraiser alone.

Where can I use Scrip?

There are over 200 local and national merchants that participate in the Scrip program, including Fred Meyer, Safeway, New Seasons, Burgerville, Lowe's, Petco, and Papa Murphy's, just to name a few.

How do I purchase Scrip?

There are two ways you can purchase scrip – you can complete the order form that is included with the newsletter and have your payment to school by 8:15 am every other Tuesday beginning September 8th, or you can purchase what we have on hand. We only keep popular merchants on hand (Fred Meyers, New Seasons, etc).

We also accept credit card payments (for orders placed on Tuesday mornings)!

Recycling, Waste Reduction and Fundraising Opportunities at Astor

As an Oregon Green School, Astor is dedicated to helping with waste reduction of harder to recycle items on the list below. There are collection bins in the main hallway (past the office and before the library) for collection of these various items.

<u>Drink pouches – Fundraiser</u> <u>through Terracycle</u>

Any brand juice pouches including straw (not the box type juice)

<u>Bar wrappers – Fundraiser</u> <u>through Terracycle</u>

Any brand of bar wrapper (granola, power, fruit, protein, etc.)

<u>Chip bags/Salty snack bags –</u> Fundraiser through Terracycle

Any brand/style/size of chip bags or salty snack bag

Elmer's glue - Fundraiser through Terracycle

Elmer's glue sticks, bottles and caps.

Food pouch – Fundraiser through Terracycle ***NEW THIS YEAR***

Any food pouch including lid

Ink Jet Cartridges – Fundraiser for Astor school supplies

All ink jet cartridges (home printers and larger office printers)

Wine corks - Fundraiser

One of our parents makes items to sell at the Astor

Auction/Astor Bazaar and the money raised goes to the PTSO. All wine and champagne corks accepted.

<u>Rigid caps – Recycling</u> <u>through Aveda</u>

Shampoo, beverage, milk, flip top, detergent, and pharmaceutical caps. Through the "Recycle Caps with Aveda program" these items will get "upcycled" into new bottles for Aveda products. No flimsy lids please.

Batteries

Batteries are hazardous waste and should be disposed of properly. The district picks up batteries and disposes of them for schools.

Block Styrofoam

This item <u>cannot</u> be recycled curbside. If you have a small amount of block Styrofoam (no peanuts), feel free to place it in the bin in the hallway. If you have a large amount, please chat with me or visit Far West Fibers (Beaverton or Hillsboro locations ONLY)

String/Holiday Lights

String lights that are broken, not working, outdated can be turned in for metal recycling. I will transport these lights to the Oregon Zoo who has a drop off over the holiday season.

Plastic (stretchy) bags

Please consider reusing these items for your garbage cans

at home or to pick up dog waste. Dog parks often have tubes that house these bags and anyone is welcome to drop them off in these tubes. Fred Meyer also has a drop off at the front entrance.

Metal Silverware


Astor uses durable forks and spoons in the cafeteria. This allows the school not to use the "spork package" which is a spork, napkin and straw wrapped in plastic. Please bring in any metal forks and spoons, does not have to match, throughout the school year to help keep our supply up.

Far West Fibers @ 2005 N. Rosa Parks Way takes many plastic items for recycling that we do not accept at the school and that are not accepted curbside. Swing by and check them out or visit their website for more information www.farwestrecycling.com
