WHS Site Council Goals 2016-2017

- Graduation rate: Achieve graduation rate of 95% or better; no sub groups below 5% of the average (same as district milestone)
- Exclusionary discipline: reduce exclusionary disciplinary actions by 50% for all sub-groups
- Attendance Goal: 90% of students attending 90% or better for all sub-groups for average daily attendance; reduce chronic and severe from 30% to 20%
- 100% of Freshman on track for on-time graduation (same as district milestone).

- Needs more discussion AP Goal: Increase the percentage of Wilson graduates who successfully complete advanced coursework/dual credit/professional experience (e.g. more kids taking AP classes, more minority kids taking AP classes, AP scores of 3+, capstone course in drama, honors designations, internships) < suggestion to remove internship, honors for this year>; need to determine how we'll measure items outside of AP.
- Teacher professional development: every teacher is actively involved in a PLC (professional learning community) that results in a specific goal and action plans for professional development delivered by October 4

- b. Update on 9th grade communities
 - i. Next year's 9th grade class will start with a new science sequence. School is utilizing the Next Generation Science (NGS). Instead of starting with biology,, high school freshman will start with a physics/health.

 - i. The plan is to teach the Wilson Way with a school wide plan that provides expectations on:

 - Behavior on campus

- ii. The group is working on a model to deliver lesson plans to the community by February or March. A card was introduced that allows teachers to write notes to students who they observed to be modeling the "Wilson Way" behavior. The introduction of the cards will be put onto the department meeting agendas to better introduce to teachers.
- iii. Sarah Lamier joined as a guest and expressed concern at discussions that were being had to shift some Black History Month activities to March, to accommodate some scheduling challenges that Leadership had been discussing. It diminishes the importance of the month. Recommendation made to move that discussion to a different forum.
- d. Wilson goals powerpoint presentation and CAP update
 - a. Brian has update CAP plan with changes to the Executive Summary. He was waiting for more updates from various departments before he releases the updated version.
 - b. Brian noted that 2015 data for AP exams shows that 24% students receive a 3 or higher. Goals are updated to have higher percentages for student of color.
