 - Data improved to 91% graduation for last year. 4 year completion rate (GED and modified diploma included—success rate 94%. There are about 18 students in the 6% not meeting. State keeps data on 5 years so there is another piece that will come later—keeping kids connected to high school completion through the 5th year). Shout out to importance of special ed teachers who are following up with students, tracking them closely and preventing students from falling through the cracks.
 - In response to question-- this is not about any one thing—this is about resources, per Brian: being able to provide support, electives, funding for sports, adding counseling.
 - What does 100% look like in a high school system?

<u>Technology:</u> chrome books in every classroom. 2014 Wilson had zero mobile computer labs. Now ten mobile labs.

1st semester grades (Brian)

senior class 288 students. At this point, grand total of 17 students that are credit
deficient going into final semester. 6 of 17 are half credit or less off than you would
expect so very close. Those 17 are likely enrolled in enough classes to get to the
credit: night school, virtual scholars, BYU are all options. Have money from district for
credit recovery to keep some students into summer or pay for summer school or
online courses. Brian projects doing better than 91%.

ES update (Ayesha)

- Credits are half the picture. Have to have every student pass essential skills—smarter balanced test or qualifying score on PSAT, ACT, SAT or work samples. Know exactly who the students are and there are focused strategies/efforts to get students to meet the essential skills.
- b. School Climate Plan Overview 9:00-9:30 (Ayesha)
 - Teacher on Special Assignment (TOSA) assisting with school climate plan and team to address school climate.
 - Climate team for school will be site council. Could have a subcommittee work on this but school climate is integral to school improvement.
 - Discussion of importance of authenticity in gradually changing/reinforcing culture we
 want to see—not having it be formalistic or formulaic.
 - Acknowledgement and recognition of students and teachers for modeling mission values—planning is in progress.
 - Incorporating student voice into actions in the building.
- c. Credit Recovery Plan 9:30-9:45
 - Discussion of Saturday credit recovery classes (English, Biology, History, and Algebra)
 and other credit recovery opportunities for students.

Added agenda items: Forecasting

- Brian shared extensive list of new courses for next school year.
- In some instances these are completely new classes and in others they are replacing a currently offered course.
- Highlights include: Illustration, Yoga, Intro to medicine and health occupations, Advance Wilderness rescue, Web Design, Advertising, Business Management/Finance, AP French, German returning, Forecasting for possibility of Mandarin Chinese, Spanish for heritage learners, Speech and debate, Robotics, AP Art History. In the future may have an Arabic class.
