• Start up of 2016 (Brian update, parent, student and teacher perspectives) 8:40-9:00

- The <u>Oregonian article</u> from called out Wilson for meeting 9th grade milestone;
 Graduation rate was 91%, completion rate was 94%
- The general feeling of the first week was very positive across teachers, students and families
- Shout out to SaraBeth Leitch for leading the way on The Wilson Way sessions for the staff; great discussion with the staff; teachers did end up modifying how they rolled it out & liked the flexibility with the activities; wanted more modeling of some of the activities to understand it
- Question about excusing tardies teachers haven't been consistent in enforcing sending students to the attendance office to excuse a tardy; they are this year; report is going to families this week detailing last year's attendance along with reminder from Brian about clearing absences and tardies to enable staff to focus on highest priorities
- Discussions that cell phone policy is good; was some concern from students originally, but students are getting used to it.
- Feedback from students: Tutor time policy of having to be somewhere is hard to manage in some cases goes against being self-directed and don't always have their homework with them; can't use it to do other things like getting something to eat, socializing, need some spaces to be. Brian explained that tutor time is designed to be instructional time. That's why it's embedded within the day this year vs. at the end of the day. The expectation is for students to use it as it's designed. Discussion that we may be able to meet some of the wants and needs with the new policy with tutor time (spaces to meet, options if they don't need the time for homework, access to healthy food, workshops on specific topics)
 - ACTION ITEM: talk more at staff meetings about options for Tutor Time

Review of retreat. Discuss and finalize goals. 9:00-9:25

- o FINAL: Graduation rate: Achieve graduation rate of 95% or better; no sub groups below 5% of the average (same as district milestone)
- FINAL: Exclusionary discipline: reduce exclusionary disciplinary actions by 50% for all sub-groups

- FINAL: Attendance Goal: 90% of students attending 90% or better for all subgroups for average daily attendance; reduce chronic and severe from 30% to 20%
- FINAL: 100% of Freshman on track for on-time graduation (same as district milestone)
- O Needs more discussion AP Goal: Increase the percentage of Wilson graduates who successfully complete advanced coursework/dual credit/professional experience (e.g. more kids taking AP classes, more minority kids taking AP classes, AP scores of 3+, capstone course in drama, honors designations, internships) <suggestion to remove internship, honors for this year>; need to determine how we'll measure items outside of AP.
 - ACTION ITEM: Talk with instructional leaders to refine the non-AP part of goal
- FINAL: Teacher professional development: every teacher is actively involved in a PLC (professional learning community) that results in a specific goal and action plans for professional development delivered by October 4
- AVID, Equity and Climate Plans are all strategies to achieve our goals and will be embedded into action plans for each of the goals.
