How to Purchase School Meals

Student Meal Accounts

Each student has a personal debit account linked to their PPS student identification (ID) number. Student ID numbers can be found on the fall student verification form provided by the school. After students make their meal selection in the kitchen, they enter their student ID number via a pin pad at the cash register to complete the purchase.

Student Meals Status

All students grades PK-12 are eligible to apply for free or reduced meal benefits (up to \$1,000 per year), if the family meets income guidelines or receives Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits via the State. Below is a list of student meal statuses and information on when to submit a meal application for free and reduced benefits.

*Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

The intent of CEP is to improve student access to free school meals in eligible schools and to eliminate the burden for families who are required to complete complicated applications annually. Families of students attending one of the CEP sites listed below do not need to submit a meal application. ALL students are provided free breakfast and lunches at no charge. However, if a student transfers to a **non**-CEP site, a meal application needs to be submitted (for those who wish to apply for free or reduced benefits).

Payment Types	Additional Information	
Cash	Funds deposited the same day they are received.	
Check	Funds deposited the same day they are received. Highly recommended for tracking purposes.	
<u>MySchoolBucks</u>	A secure online prepayment system where parent/guardians can deposit funds via debit or credit card. There is no charge to register and view your student's account. NOTE: When making prepayments, there is a \$1.95 fee per transaction. The charge will show on your bank or credit card statement as "MSB PORTLAND PUBLIC SCHOOLS".
