Our CDL teachers are in communication with families on a daily basis. Please be sure to address your question to them and they will do all they can to support you and your children. The focus of CDL continues to be synchronous lessons for Math, Literacy, and Social Emotional Learning (SEL). Lessons in Science, Social Studies, Library, and Health are provided asynchronously. Music and PE teachers offer one synchronous and one asynchronous lesson for each grade each week. We hope you are back in the rhythm of CDL with your new teachers and classmates!



It is so nice to have students back in the building and to see their excitement as they create, learn and grow together. # Arrival and Dismissal

Please remember to wait until you pull up in front of the school to drop off and pick up your children. It's not safe for them to load and unload at or before the portables or in the fire zone.

Please remember there is no parking in the car line! If you feel like you need more time to load and unload your students, especially our youngest students, please park and walk to pick

up your students from their teacher.

For kindergarten and 1st grade students please pull forward to the corner/2nd grade sign, or as far as you can to help with traffic flow during drop off and pick up.

- 3rd grade and Trinchero's students should still get picked up and dropped off in the back car line.
- For K, 1, 2, Bannon, Robbins, and 5, please continue to pull up past the front door of the school for arrival and dismissal. The more we spread out, the faster things seem to go. Big kids will meet their cars past the school along the sidewalk. This is helping with traffic flow.

Thank you for working with us as we establish new routines and systems. Please keep your feedback coming if you have ideas for improving things for our students.

If you have a change in pickup plans, please either send a note with your student to give to the teacher or call the office so that we can write a note for your student. It is extremely important that we know with as much advance notice if there is a change in plans for that day!

# FOOD AND SUPPLY SUBSTITUTIONS

The impact on the national supply chain due to COVID, restaurants and other businesses reopening, and the back up at the Port of Los Angeles have all impacted our ability to receive food and supplies as we have menued and ordered. For these reasons, families may see changes in packaging - how foods are packaged and the style of bag that we serve the meals in or how foods are packed may be different between schools based on what they have on hand to use. Families may also experience substitutions on the menu. With these impacts, we are still committed to offering all students breakfast and lunch for free. # <u>Updated Information on Meal Applications</u>

While meals are served at no cost to children ages 1-18 at several Portland Public School sites this year, there are several benefits for eligible families to submit a meal application this school year.

- Families approved for free and reduced-price meals may be eligible to receive future potential government assistance such as Pandemic EBT benefits (\*please note that Oregon has not been approved yet for expanded Pandemic EBT benefits; we will alert families when we learn more and if it is approved).
- Families may be eligible for other benefits such as school related fee reduction or waivers, low cost internet and health coverage.

Families do not need to submit a meal application if any of the following apply:

- All students in the household attend a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school (list located online: https://www.pps.net/Page/2088) where students eat meals at no cost.
- A meal application has already been submitted and approved for the 2020-21 school year.
- The household received a 2020-21 Direct Certification Approval letter.
- The household does not meet the 2020-21 Federal Income Guidelines
