### **The SafeOregon Tip Line aims to increase student safety**

In keeping with our commitment to student safety, last October PPS joined school districts across the state in using the SafeOregon Tip Line. We want to remind you about this important resource.

SafeOregon was funded by the Oregon Legislature as part of a statewide effort to improve school safety. **It provides a secure means for anyone to anonymously report suspicious or imminently unsafe situations, such as threats of violence, fights, drugs and alcohol, weapons, bullying, harassment, intimidation or self-harm.**

Anyone, from students to parents to community members, can access the system in a variety of ways, including:

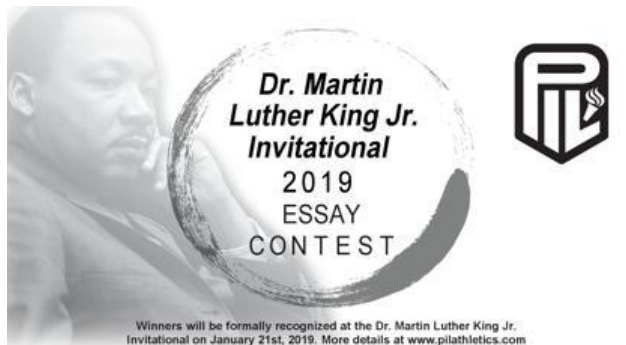
Whaaat? Time to think about spring and summer already? Yes! See below for some fun opportunities for experiences and paying jobs:

OHSU Partnership for Scientific Inquiry for 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students: The Partnership for Scientific Inquiry is a spring term program which encourages student participation in science competitions and fosters a mentoring relationship with local scientists. Selected students will meet on Tuesdays from 5:00-7:00 p.m. (February-May) for a lecture series at OHSU to learn about ongoing research projects conducted by scientists at Oregon Health & Science University, Portland State University, and Legacy Research Institute. Each student will be mentored by a researcher and gain firsthand knowledge of research methods and develop their own research proposal. The program requires regular attendance and significant time commitment outside of class for homework and research proposal development. Students may elect to do laboratory research (or possibly clinical research, depending on the mentor) over the summer. Students are also encouraged to develop a science fair project with the assistance of their mentor. Most mentors will offer students who are 16 and older an opportunity to carry out his/her proposed research during the summer. Learn more about PSI and consider applying now. A letter of recommendation from a math or science teacher is recommended. Application materials due January 1.

All non-common application school transcripts will be sent by our transcript secretary quickly. Common Application requires a package be sent by the counselor, which includes a school report form, counselor report form, school profile, letter of recommendation (or we can say that we are not using this option) and the transcript. It is expected that any student who chooses to use the Common Application to a college has had a conversation with their counselor and we are working on completing this process together.
