FAQ's:

- 1. *When can I buy a ticket?* Tickets will be sold (to students with a current Dance Permission form on file) at lunch and after school Tues-Fri leading up to the dance
- 2. What's the Dance Permission form about and how do I know if we have one on file? Students are required to have a 2019-20 Dance Permission form on file before they can buy a ticket. This is signed by the parent/guardian and returned to the main office. We have about 900 students with these on file already a list of ID #'s that are cleared to purchase tickets is posted near center hall.
- 3. *Where are Dance Permission forms found?* They are in the main office and on the website's https://www.pps.net/Page/13306
- 4. *Can I bring a guest from another school?* Guest Pass Applications are required if a Grant student would like to bring another high school student to this dance. Forms are in the main office and on the website. **All Guest Pass Applications are due Monday 12/9.** These require the guest's family and school to complete sections and then be returned and approved before the Grant student may purchase a guest ticket.
- 5. *Can I pay for dance tickets through School Pay or with a credit card in person?* Unfortunately, this is not a current option. We are exploring for the future, but at this time students must have cash or check when they purchase tickets.

CAREER CENTER

Opportunities for hands-on exploration:

- Perry Outreach Program for Senior, female-identifying students: the Perry Initiative seeks to inspire young women to be leaders in Orthopaedic Surgery and Engineering by partnering with medical center, universities and high schools. They are offering a one day hands-on FREE workshop for students to explore different workshop modules and receive mentorship from women surgeons and engineers. The day happens on January 18th. - 2. <u>PACE, free after-school mentorship program to explore the Construction Trades:</u> Do you like to work with your hands? Build things? Make stuff? Consider PACE PACE stands for "Plumbing, Air, Carpentry and Electrical". It's a program that gives students in grades 9-12 a chance to work with plumbers, sheet metal professionals, carpenters and electricians and learn introductory skills needed to enter the apprenticeships for the Construction trades. It's fun! You work with the professionals and students from other schools to build a wall, plumb it, create air shafts through it and electrify it. Students who meet program expectations receive a tool kit and a network of professionals who can help them explore this industry further. Come to the Career Center for a flyer and registration form. Mentorship takes place from late January through mid-March. Apply NOW as it's first come first served.

3. <u>ASE (Apprenticeships in Science and Engineering) summer program:</u> Are you a 9-11th grader? Are you interested in a career as a scientist, doctor, engineer or technologist? Then you should come to the ASE [PRONOUNCED ACE if read aloud] summer internship information session here at Grant in the Library on Thursday, January 30th at 7:00 PM. ASE matches scientists, engineers and technology innovators with students like you for 8 week internships over the summer. ASE is a great way to the STEM field deeply, improve your college application, and you can even get school credit and a \$1,000 stipend! I.D. / HOP PASS INFORMATION - This year your Grant High School student ID card is a magnetized HOP pass that works with the new HOP pass machines on the busses. Students are required to have an active, working Student ID/HOP Card to ride the bus. Your regular bus driver may let you ride for free, but don't wait until a new bus driver decides to charge you to ride. If any of the following happens please see Ms. Martin in the main office:
