CAREER CENTER

Welcome back students!

We are excited to work with you in the Career Center this year. The Career Center (or CC for short!) is located in room 128 on the south side of the building, kitty corner from the Counseling Center and en route to the Gym. We will be open this year from 8:15AM to 4:15M.

What can you do in the CC? Lots! It's a place to get good productive work done, learn how to explore careers, attend a college visit, get help with college applications and essays, learn how to find money for college or apprenticeship, find a volunteer position and even a paying job.

These opportunities have already crossed our desk:

 <u>Paying job - Recreation Aide for City of Portland Sports Leagues</u>: looking for students aged 14 and up (another lucky break!) to work Saturdays during Youth Volleyball and/or Youth Basketball season. You'll work 3 assigned games per Saturday and ensure game safety and adherence to the rules. Go to <u>https://www.governmentjobs.com/careers/portlandor</u> and search for "Recreation Aide – Sports Leagues Casual Staff. Deadline to apply for Volleyball season is September 7th – tomorrow and October 10th for Basketball season.

- 2.) <u>Internship Adventist Medical Center "Student Healthcare Leaders:</u> are you a sophomore or junior interested in exploring the world of healthcare? Apply to this 10-week after-school program at Adventist to learn about the abundance of career opportunities via interactive explorations and panel discussions. You can also get your CPR and BLS certificate. And free dinner! More information and application available in the Career Center or go to <u>http://studenthealthcareleaders.com/</u>. Program starts September 29th and runs through December 10th.
- 3.) <u>Internship Johnson Creek Watershed Council Bi-Lingual Nature Program:</u> seeking bilingual students (ideally Chinese or Russian speaking) to help under-represented communities access Portland's natural areas. As a "Speak Creek" Intern, you'll work with Johnson Creek staff to ensure that activities across the watershed progress with equity, inclusivity and cultural relevance. You'll translate outreach materials and plan a nature-based event for a multilingual, refugee, immigrant and/or culturally-specific community within the watershed. \$15/hour and the positions (2) are open now until filled. Work happens early September to late October/early November. 4-10 hours/week with flexibility for school schedule. Come to the Career Center for more information and instructions for applying.

PPS schools have identified concerns about youth vaping. School personnel have observed students engaging in risky behaviors such as buying, exchanging, and selling vaping devices, cannabis, and other illegal substances. Schools also report that there is a growing concern among their parent population that youth use is impacting their ability to function at school, home, and with friends. TESTING INFORMATION

PSAT Test - All 10th graders will be taking the PSAT on Wednesday October 16th. The test is free to all 10th graders. All 10th graders will be receiving their copy of the Student Guide for the PSAT/NMSQT in their English class this week. 11th graders wishing to retake the PSAT must first pay for the test online at School Pay. SAT Test - Grant 11th graders will be taking the SAT this year **NOT** the ACT. The test will take place on Wednesday March 4, 2020.

AP Registration will happen in May 2020 will be OPENING SOON. You will need to get the Exam registration code from your AP teacher once registration opens. <u>You must register for your AP test by November 1, 2019</u>. There will be no late registration or walk-in's again this year. Since registration is early this year you are only being asked to make a nonrefundable \$40.00 deposit at the time of registration. Final payment will be due before testing begins.
