FROM THE LIBRARY

Dear Marysville Families,

With the return of students to school for hybrid style education, I would like to ask that if your child is returning to the building, that they bring their bag of books with them if they have one. I am going to start distributing bags at school and need to have the bags back in order to have enough to do so. Your child can just bring that bag to school and leave it right outside the classroom in the hall, leaning against the wall. I will come pick them up!

When they are back, the students will have the option to either put up to 2 books on hold and/or choose to take home a bag of books. The students can put the books on hold through our library catalog, Destiny Discover. To request a bag of books, the teachers will ask the students every other Monday if they'd like a bag, and I will deliver the bags and/or books on hold to the outside of the classroom every other Thursday. Students may not get new bags or books until they return the ones they already have. The exchange will happen every 2 weeks.

Here is a LINK to a video explaining how to put books on hold. This video was part of a Seesaw activity posted in February, so some things have changed: books on hold will be distributed on Thursdays, and/or can be picked up during the book distribution times. The distribution will now only be on Mondays and Wednesdays (NOT Fridays) from 3-4:30pm.



FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Marysville Families!

We are so excited to welcome you back! To keep your kids safe, we want to go over a few reminders. We will be visually screening students as they come in but if you have any concerns before they get here, please keep them home.

Based on the district guidelines, if they display any of the following you <u>must</u> keep them home:

- Fever/Chills
- · shortness of breath
- · new or consistent/worsening cough
- loss of taste or smell
- · new rash/hives or sores
- · diarrhea or vomiting
- recent positive test for COVID-19

**If your child shows any of these symptoms while in school, we will call home. Please be prepared to come and pick up your student as soon as possible if this happens. **

IMMUNIZATIONS:

If you have not updated your immunization records yet, please be prepared to do so the first day your student is back. IF we do not have current immunization records on file, your student will not be able to return until we have them in hand. Due to distance learning we have not had to enforce this but if your child received an exclusion order and was not cleared, you will be required to get updated immunizations for your student(s) before they can return. This is a State requirement.
