PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Marysville Families,

Happy November and welcome to our second quarter of learning! As we enter this next term we would appreciate your feedback. Please let us know what is working or if you are experiencing any challenges.

In addition to learning, safety is a priority for us. One area of ongoing concern is the traffic around school during arrival and dismissal. Please drop off students on the building side of the street, facing the correct traffic direction. If students need to cross the street, they should use the crosswalk in front of the school on Raymond or at the corner of 77th and Raymond. It is very unsafe for students to run across the street in the middle of traffic! Also, please do not park or stop to drop off students in the bus zone located on the northwest corner of the school building(along 77th Ave, by the ramp doorway).

Our other safety concern is student illness. Please do not send a student to school if they have any of the following symptoms: Fever, New Cough or difficulty breathing, Headache, Diarrhea, Vomiting, skin rash, red eyes, jaundice, or acting differently without a reasonable explanation.

Thank you for your cooperation and consideration. We want all of us to be in school as much as possible and to stop the spread!

Maintaining connections between families and classrooms is always important to us.

Fortunately, it's almost Conference Time!

- Teachers value this chance to sit down with you for an uninterrupted time to create meaningful connections around your child's educational experience.
- You know more about your student than anyone at school.
- Talking with the teacher about your student will help pave the way for your student to do well in class and will help you to understand what is happening at school.

FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

A note about Immunizations:

Letters recently went out about missing or incomplete immunizations. If you have received one of these letters, please bring any updated immunization information to your school before winter break in December. If your child has received the vaccines, fill in the dates on the enclosed Certificate of Immunization Status form, sign it, and bring it to your child's school. If you would like to get your child vaccinated, bring the enclosed Certificate of Immunization Status form to your medical provider or a Multnomah County Student Health Center.

* If you would like a nonmedical exemption for your child, you need to turn in two forms: 1. Certificate of Immunization Status—Fill in the dates of any vaccines your child has received, fill out the nonmedical exemption section by marking the vaccines for which you would like an exemption, and sign the form. AND 2. Vaccine Education Certificate— This certificate is provided after either receiving the required education about immunizations from a health care practitioner or after watching the online vaccine education module and printing the certificate. If your child needs a medical exemption, get a letter from your child's healthcare provider and bring it to the school. Medical exemptions are reviewed and approved by the Multnomah County Health Department.

Exclusion day is the third Wednesday in February. Per Oregon law, children whose immunization records are not current by this date will not be able to attend school until their information is updated.

* Student Health Centers are no cost medical clinics, located within high schools. They are available to all Multnomah County families with school-age children and youth (ages 5-18).
