Getting Home...

On the SUN registration form, there are two options available: Pick-up by parent/guardian **OR** student's discretion (activity bus, walk, bike, Tri-Met).

The activity bus will begin running on the first day of programming. If you have selected student's discretion, your student is eligible to take the activity bus home. **Misbehavior may lead to the loss of bus privileges.**

CONEXIONES (Latino Network)

Conexiones is a Latino Network program that meets 1-2 times/week during and after school hours. The bilingual-bicultural instructors serve as positive role models for Lane MS students and follow a curriculum that explores themes that emphasize: leadership, self-identity, prosocial skills, effective communication, habits of successful students, college and career exposure, and Latinx cultural-identity. Instructors also support youth and families with home visits, resources and referrals and often assist parents in communicating with teachers and school administrators.

Conexiones es un programa de Latino Network que se reúne 1-2 veces por semana durante y después del horario escolar. Los instructores bilingües-biculturales sirven como modelos positivos para los estudiantes de Lane MS y siguen un plan de estudios que explora temas que enfatizan: liderazgo, identidad propia, habilidades prosociales, comunicación efectiva, hábitos de estudiantes exitosos, exposición universitaria y profesional, y cultura Latinx.
