## REGISTERING FOR THE PPS INDIAN EDUCATION PROGRAM



If you have Native American ancestry, your child may qualify to be registered in the PPS Indian Education program.

The Title VI Indian Education Project provides supplementary education support to students of documented American Indian / Alaskan Native ancestry.



Our project provides cultural education to connect students with their Native history, cultures and traditions, instilling pride and confidence to achieve challenging academic standards.

### To enroll in our program:

- Parent/Guardian must fully fill out a 506 Form and return it to our office / school secretary
- Student must be enrolled in PPS school or contracted program
- Student must meet federal eligibility requirements (student, parent or grandparent enrolled in a State, Federally-recognized, or select terminated Tribe/Band/Nation)

**Chocolate Pecan  
Bites**

## **CHOCOLATE PECAN BITES**

Makes about 12 to 14 small bites

It's hard to deny the allure of chocolate, the gift of the ancient Aztecs to the Spanish. Chocolate was first enjoyed as a dark, bitter beverage, and sugar was introduced later on. Here we've blended cocoa butter, raw cocoa powder, and pecans with a little agave as a sweetener. Although none of these ingredients are native to our region, they represent the ways we can all share in the joys of indigenous flavors throughout the Americas.

½ cup cocoa butter  
½ cup raw cocoa powder  
2 cups pecans, lightly toasted  
Pinch salt  
½ vanilla bean  
3 tablespoons agave to taste

Line a small tray or flat plate with parchment paper. In a small saucepan set over low heat, melt the cocoa butter. Stir in the cocoa powder and set aside.

In a food processor fitted with a steel blade, grind the pecans into a paste, stopping occasionally to scrape down the sides. Slowly add the cocoa butter mixture, salt, the seeds of the vanilla bean, and agave until smooth.

Transfer the mixture to a bowl and, using a teaspoon, shape small balls or bites and set on the parchment-lined tray. Put into the refrigerator until set. Serve at room temperature.

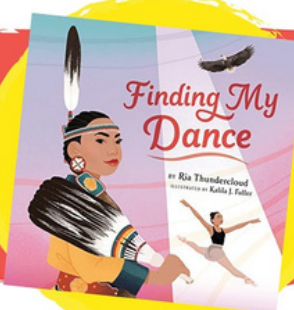
