Offered Resources and Support


- TANF (Temporary assistance for needy families)
- Diverted Services which maintains current emplovment
- TANF Work Experience, paid training to gain real world work experience and employment references
- Non-Needy Caretaker Relative: Cash grant to caretaker relative of TANF eligible children
- House Stabilization for Victims of Domestic Violence
- Classroom Training: Assistance with GED, higher education, vocational training, or certification
- Work Experience: Paid training to gain real world work experience and employment references
- On-the-Job Training: Employer incentive based program
- Direct Placement: If hired by an employer and need supportive services to become job ready
- Core Services: Provides employment enhancement services to clients
- Supplemental Youth Services: Summer employment or educational services to youth 14-24

Who is eligible?

- Enrolled members of federally recognized tribes, descendants
- Live in the Siletz Tribe's approved service area (see flyer for map)
- · Household income must fall within the program income guidelines or employment services guidelines

How do I apply?

- Request an application in the area you reside (tribal offices are located in Siletz, Salem, Portland, and Eugene)
- Complete the application, provide all required documentation
- Schedule an intake appointment
- · Program eligibility determination
