

## Native & Montessori Values

**In this classroom, Native themes and values are infused throughout the curriculum. The Montessori educational environment shares common values with Native learning styles and beliefs.** For example, our community is mixed ages (3-5 year olds) which creates a familial learning environment similar to the extended family concept of tribes. Native traditions of learning supports students to learn from their peers regardless of age. In our community, children care for one another and learn from each other. As each child's Guide (teacher), our primary question in our daily work with children is, “What can be done to adapt the environment or materials to allow the child’s inborn potential to unfold?”
