Lice Policy: Head lice is a public health issue that can affect a student's focus and comfort and can be passed on to other students in a group setting. Therefore:

A student with live lice will be excluded from camp and sent home with lice treatment information and resources. A student with no live lice may return to camp. Parents are strongly urged to remove all nits from their child's hair to help prevent re-infestation and transmission.

Students will be re-checked for lice and nits upon initial re-entry and each day of camp thereafter.

Pick up and Drop off Policy: Parent/guardians must walk in with their students and sign them in on our daily attendance roster when dropping off students for camp. Parents/guardians must also walk in to pickup their student and sign them out on our daily attendance roster. Only persons included on the lines below will be eligible to pick up your student from camp. For safety reasons, we will not release students to family members, teachers, older siblings or any adult who does not appear on the approved pick up list below. Anyone picking up a child from NAYA may be required to provide photo identification.
