What are the dates this year?

Friday, February 8, and Friday, February 22.

Who can attend?

RGMS students can attend and ride the ski bus. If a family would like to drive up separately, we can still offer the group rate prices through SUN School. Family members, including parents, must register, pay in advance, and meet us at the mountain to receive the lift tickets. Transportation is the family's responsibility.

What are the costs?

You can use your own season lift tickets, equipment and transportation. Select what works best for each individual.

RGMS SKI CLUB 2019 Information

What forms do I need to fill out?

- <u>SUN Registration Form</u>- all students need to be registered with SUN; fill out form if not already on file with SUN (one for both trips)
- <u>SUN Adult Registration Form</u>- all adult participants and chaperones must complete and return this short form (even if you only purchased a lift ticket; one for each trip).
- <u>Liability Waiver</u>- needs to be read and signed by parent as well as the student. (one time for both trips)
- <u>Rental Form</u>- only needs to be filled out if your student is renting equipment at Meadows. (one for each trip)
- <u>Medical Release</u>- required for all students (one time for both trips). It is required by Meadows.

What time will students leave school?

Students will be leaving RGMS at 2:30pm (shortly before 6th period). Due to traffic and driving time to Mt Hood Meadows, we need plenty of time to get there. We want to ski!

Are there any restrictions on attending?

Students must be in good academic standing for their classes and also exhibit RGMS's three values of respectful, responsible and safe. If a student exhibits unruly behavior on the trip, they will be excluded from participating in future trips. This includes disrespect, defiance, cursing, throwing food, being loud, tossing garbage in the bus, and other problem behaviors.

How do students get dinner and snacks?

Please send them with food or money to purchase food. They will be hungry AND thirsty! Food is available for sale at Meadows.

What is the adult-to-student ratio?

Mt. Hood Meadows requires a ratio of 1 adult to 16 students. With four PPS staff, we will be within ratio. There is still the potential that students will ski on their own. If that does not seem appropriate for your student, they can consider attending next year.

What time does the lesson start?

The group beginner lessons begin at 6:00 pm and last for two hours. During that time, students are chaperoned by Mt. Hood Meadows instructional staff.

What time will students be leaving the mountain and arriving back at RGMS?

Mt. Hood Meadows closes at 9:00 pm. The bus should depart around 9:30 pm with 1 hour and 45 minutes of drive time (without traffic). Students should arrive back to RGMS around 11:15 pm. Please be mindful that this timing is not exact! Please be on site to pick up your tired child promptly.

Whom can I contact on the day of the trip?

Can I pick my student up at Meadows? Yes,

students can be checked out by an authorized parent or legal guardian. Parents, please present a photo ID to SUN staff to verify identity when asking for release. You will be asked to physically sign your student out.

What does chaperoning involve? Chaperones have the option to either ski with their student and friends or "patrol" the resort on their own. RGMS students will be wearing an identifying marker on their jackets. Chaperones will need to provide their own transportation and purchase their lift tickets through our awesome group rate.
