School and Community:

Cleveland High School is one of nine public high schools in Portland, Oregon. An urban high school in inner southeast Portland, Cleveland draws from socio-economically mixed neighborhoods and serves a diverse population of approximately 1680 students. Our International Baccalaureate and Chinese Immersion programs draw students from throughout the Portland area. As a four-year comprehensive high school, Cleveland is renowned for its high academic standards in all content areas, multiple opportunities in the fine and performing arts, and a warm and accepting school climate. Cleveland has a comprehensive English Language Learners program for about 50 students speaking more than 13 languages. The composition of the student body is as follows:

Academic Program:

Cleveland High School became an affiliate school in the International Baccalaureate program in the spring of 2000. The year 2001–2002 was the first year of IB participation and examination. Cleveland is one of two high schools offering the IB program in Portland. Selected Cleveland students have the opportunity to participate in the Reed College Young Scholars Program and the Templeton Scholars Program at Lewis and Clark College. CHS offers a Mandarin Immersion program. Content-based courses are taught in Mandarin with the aim of students becoming bilingual and bi-literate with a high level of multicultural understanding.

Rank Order and GPA:

Cleveland computes both weighted and unweighted GPAs. Unweighted rank and GPA is calculated based on the cumulative grade point average of all classes on a four-point scale. Weighted GPA is recalculated with a weighted differential based on a five-point scale for IB classes only. The highest weighted GPA for the class of 2017 was 4.47.
