## COVID UPDATE

March 13th was the last day of in-person instruction for the 2019-2020 school year at Roosevelt High School. The 2020-2021 school year began with online only instruction on September 2, 2020, and will continue for the fall term until at least November 5, 2020. Portland Public Schools will announce, in October of 2020, if online instruction will continue or if instruction will happen in person after November 5th. Decisions are contingent on the State of Oregon Governor's orders and the Oregon Department of Education guidance.

## GRADING, SCHEDULE, AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS DURING COVID

Portland Public Schools, in response to required guidance from the Oregon Department of Education, moved to Passing (P) and Incomplete (INC) grades for all high school coursework beginning March 2020 due to COVID school closures and the state shift to distance learning. This grading adjustment is reflected on the spring 2020 portion of student transcripts. Students have until June 2021 to complete any Incomplete course. For the 2020-2021 school year letter grades will be awarded.

In addition proficiency credit and pass grades were issued for coursework which met Oregon Department of Education guidelines for proficiency credit. These credits are noted on students transcript with proficiency next to the course name (i.e. Eng 4- Proficiency) and a grade of P (Pass).

The 2019-2020 in-person class schedule consisted of a block schedule with students following an A/B rotation and taking 4 classes each day; periods 1-4 on A days and period 5-8 on B days. When classes started online, March 13, 2020, students used Google Classroom to complete and submit assignments. Teachers held office hours and some classes had regularly scheduled live meeting times. Portland Public School provided a suggested daily schedule for students to follow.

For the 2020-2021 school year online learning will follow a block schedule with students taking two classes per day, synchronously, and two classes asynchronously four days a week. On the fifth day of the week students will participate in an Advisory Period for 30 minutes and do asynchronous learning the rest of the day. Students will take four of eight classes each semester to earn a total of eight credits for the academic year.

Graduation requirements for the classes of 2020 and 2021 were changed from the Standard Portland Public School Diploma to the Oregon 2020 Diploma, per the Oregon Department of Education.

Portland Public Schools is an urban school district in Portland, Oregon. With approximately 49,000 students in 81 schools, it is one of the largest school districts in the Pacific Northwest.

Roosevelt High School is one of seven comprehensive high schools within Portland Public Schools; serving grades 9-12.

Located near the peninsula where the Willamette and Columbia Rivers come together, Roosevelt's campus is in the evolving neighborhood of St Johns within North Portland. Roosevelt is proudly recognized as one of the most diverse high schools in the state of Oregon, with a deep-rooted multigenerational history. The building and athletic facilities at Roosevelt were completely renovated within the past five years, providing students with a secure, contemporary learning environment. Roosevelt continues to welcome new families to its rapidly growing school community.

## ACADEMICS

Roosevelt students are expected to take a rigorous, college-prep schedule which includes a full schedule for 9th, 10th and 11th graders and at least 6 out of 8 periods for 12th graders.

### Advanced Placement & Dual-Credit Courses

Roosevelt High School encourages students to take advanced courses when they feel prepared for the rigor and challenges these courses offer. Roosevelt offers both Advanced Placement and dual credit course in partnership with Portland State University, Portland Community College, and Mt. Hood Community College.

### Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID)

AVID is a nationwide, research based program that focuses on underserved students in the academic middle. Through structured support in advanced reading, writing, and research students learn the skills to be college and AP ready. Roosevelt has a strong AVID program going into its 15th year with 26% of 10th—12th grade students electing to take AVID for the 2012 - 2021 academic year. All freshman take 9th Grade Seminar, which is a college and career class using AVID strategies. After freshman year students choose if they want to continue in the AVID program.

### Spanish Language Arts

Over the past 19 years Roosevelt High School has developed a rigorous program of study for students to develop their academic Spanish skills to ultimately prepare them for upper division college Spanish coursework. The program serves students who either native Spanish speakers or come from a Spanish immersion program. The courses develop the students' reading, writing, and oral fluency through Spanish Language Arts classes similar to the in-depth study of English in Language Arts classes. Freshmen and sophomores take introductory level Spanish Language Arts courses, and juniors and seniors take AP Spanish Language & Culture and AP Spanish Literature & Culture courses, which expand their academic skills to college level and beyond. Students consistently pass the two Spanish AP exams, with 97% passing with a 3 or higher in AP Spanish Language, and 88% in AP Spanish Literature in 2020.

In May of 2020, 132 Roosevelt students took 204 Advanced Placement (AP) exams in English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, US History, Calculus AB, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Spanish Language and Culture, and Spanish Literature and Culture.
