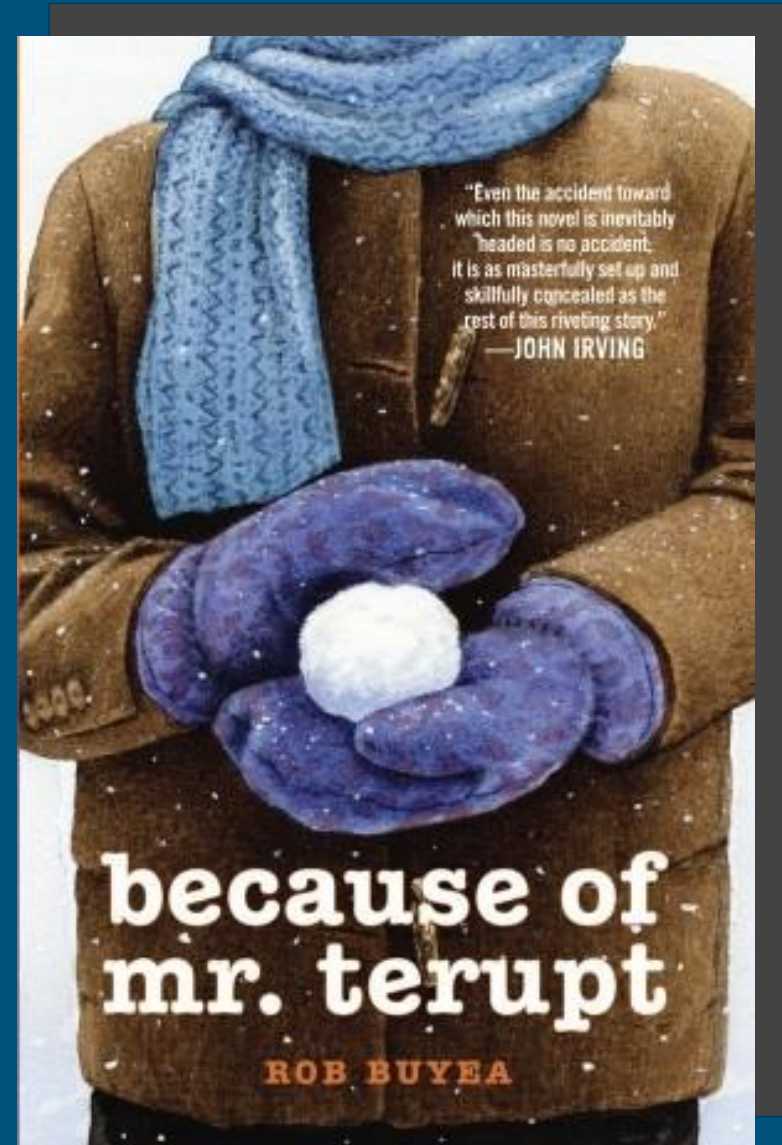

Because of Mr. Terupt

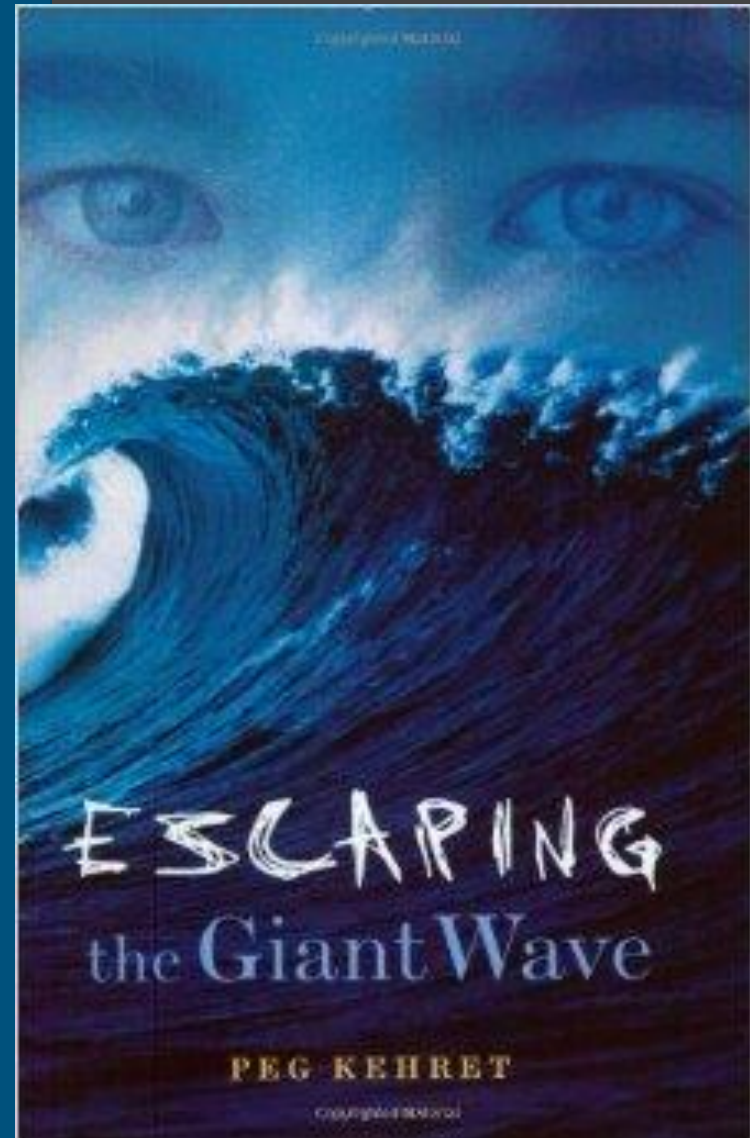

A class of outcasts, only Mr. Terupt, their new and energetic teacher, seems to know how to deal with them all.



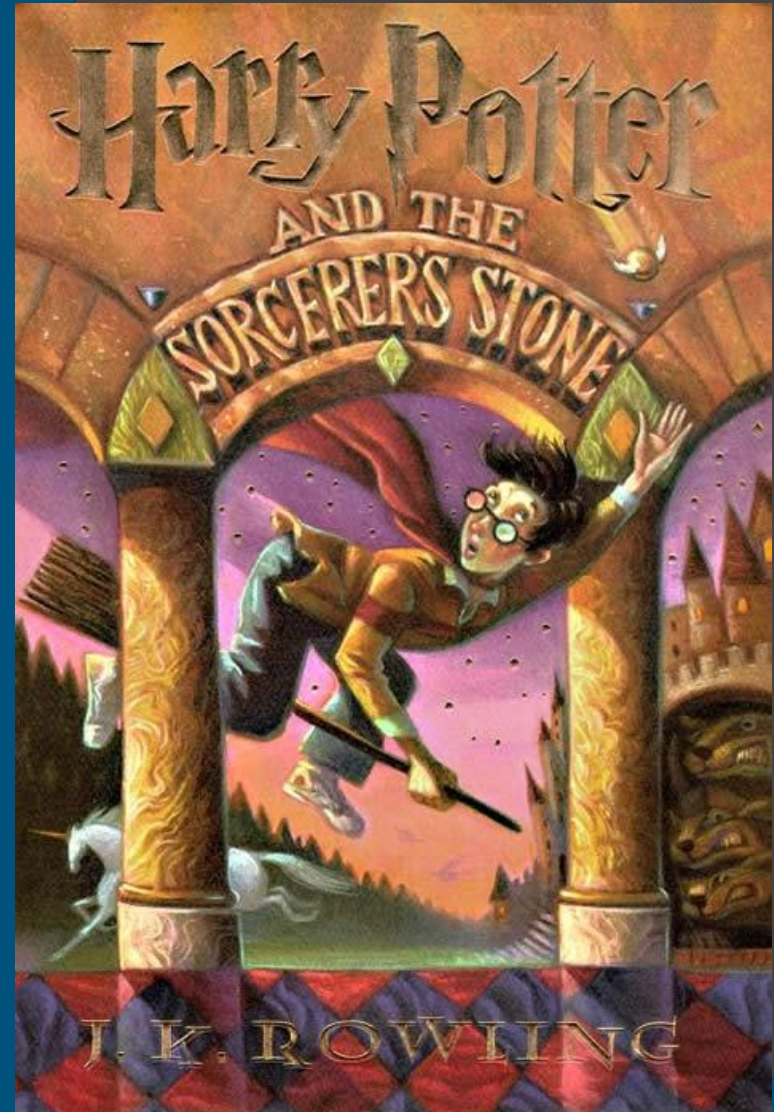
Escaping the Giant Wave by Peg Kehret

Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone by JK Rowling

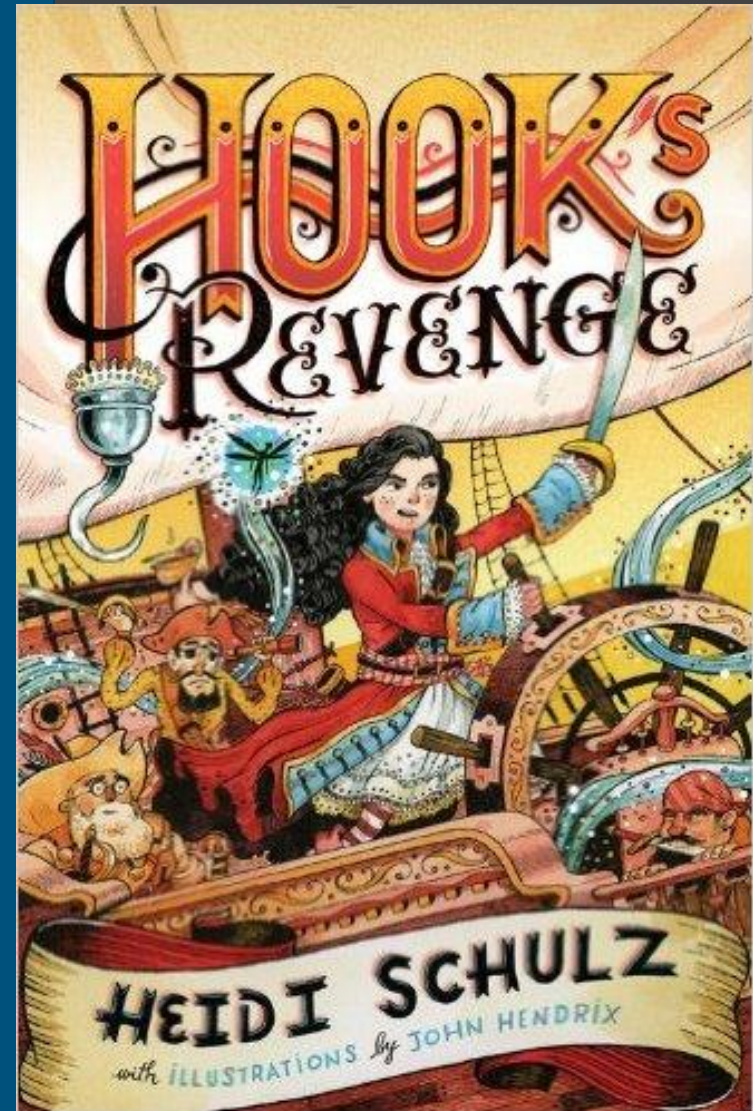

Hook's Revenge by Heidi Schulz

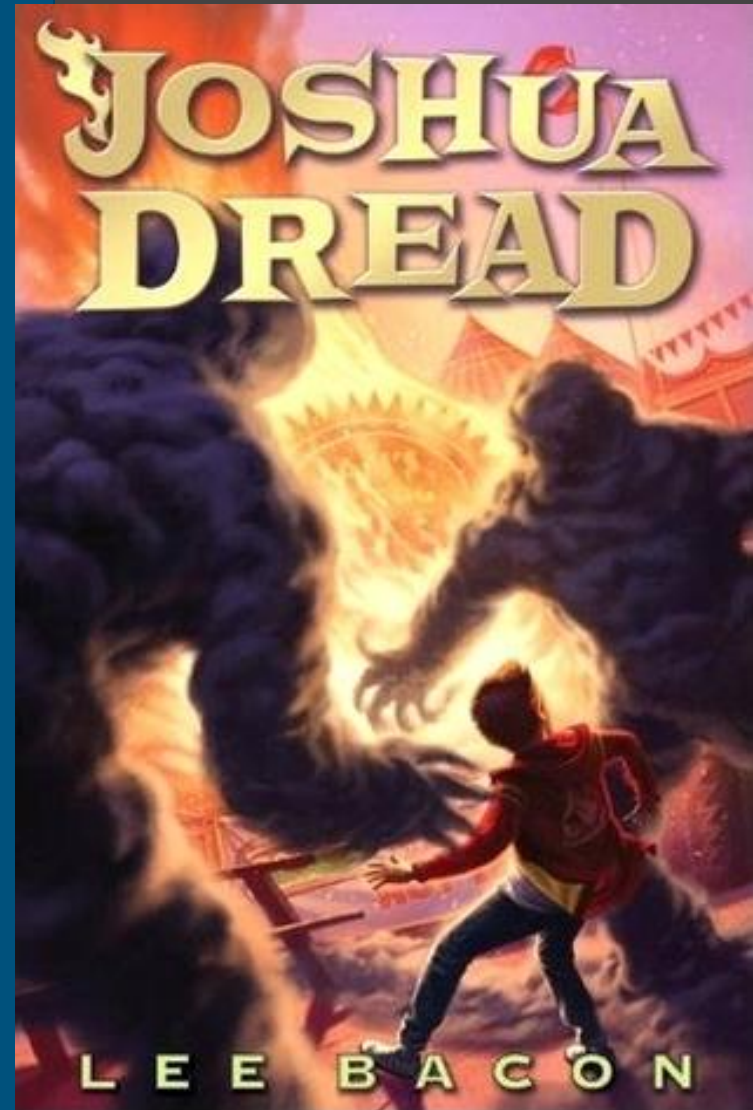

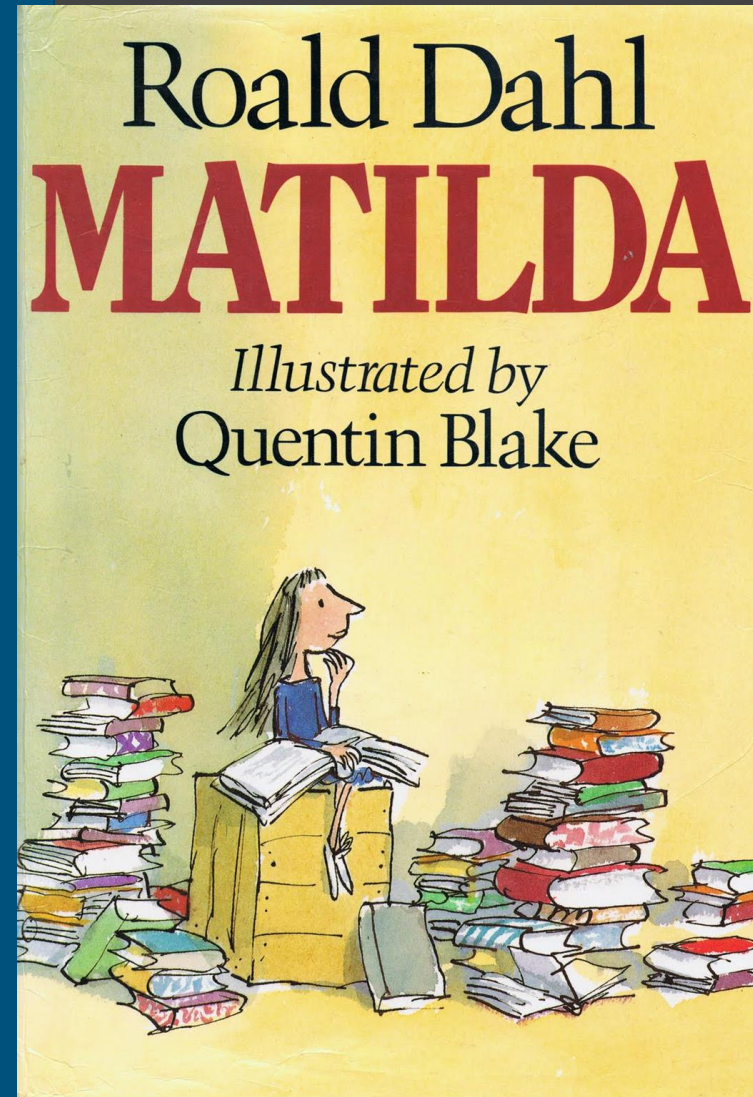
Scieszka, who grew up as the second of six sons, has written an autobiography for anyone interested in baseball, fire, and peeing on stuff.



Matilda

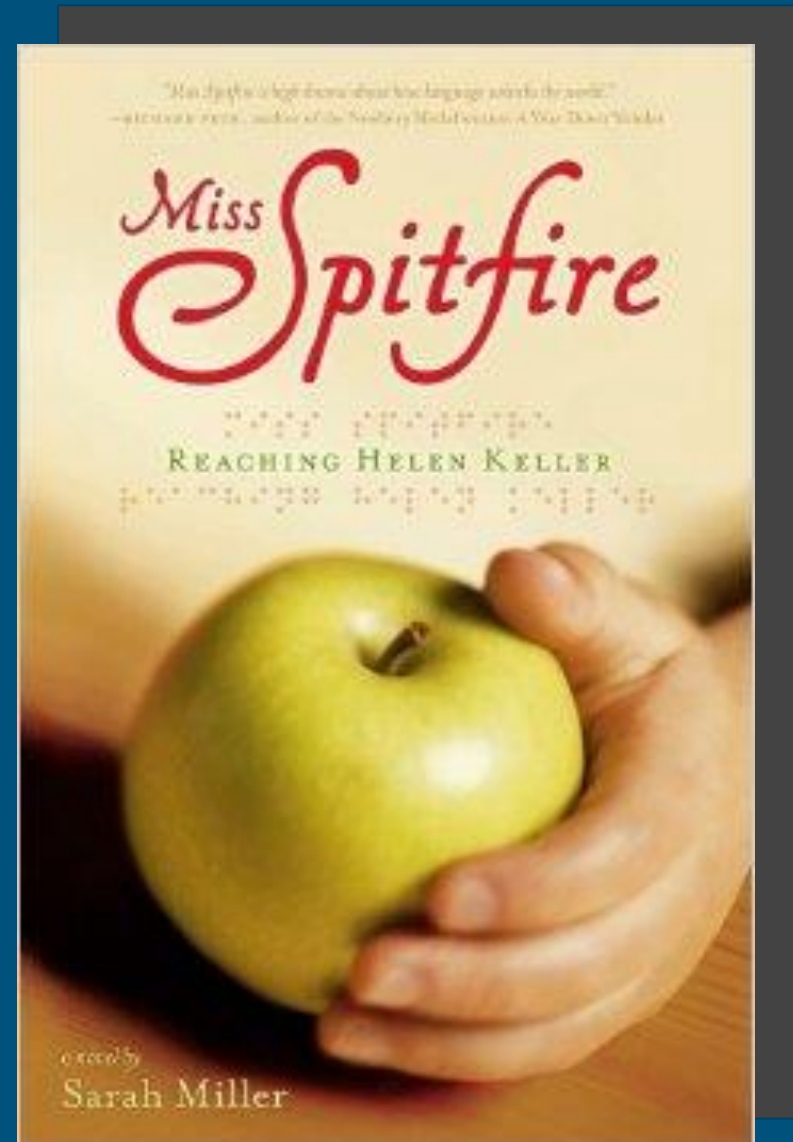

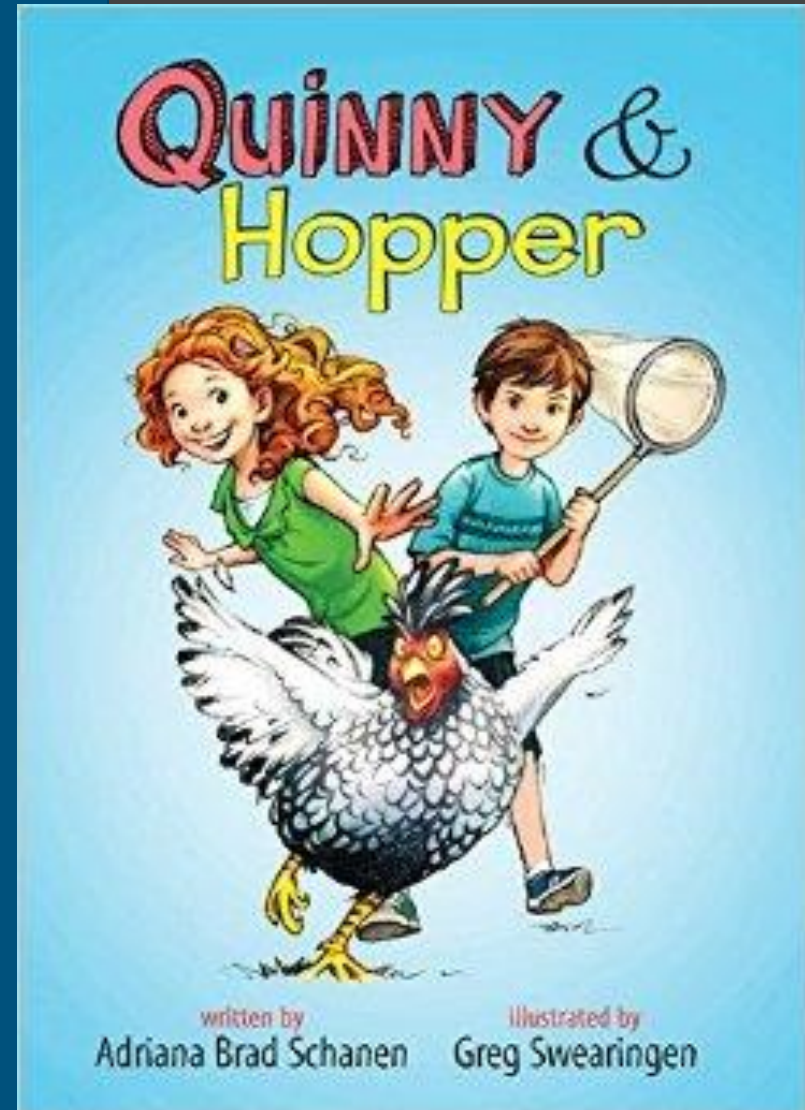
Miss Spitfire by Sarah Miller

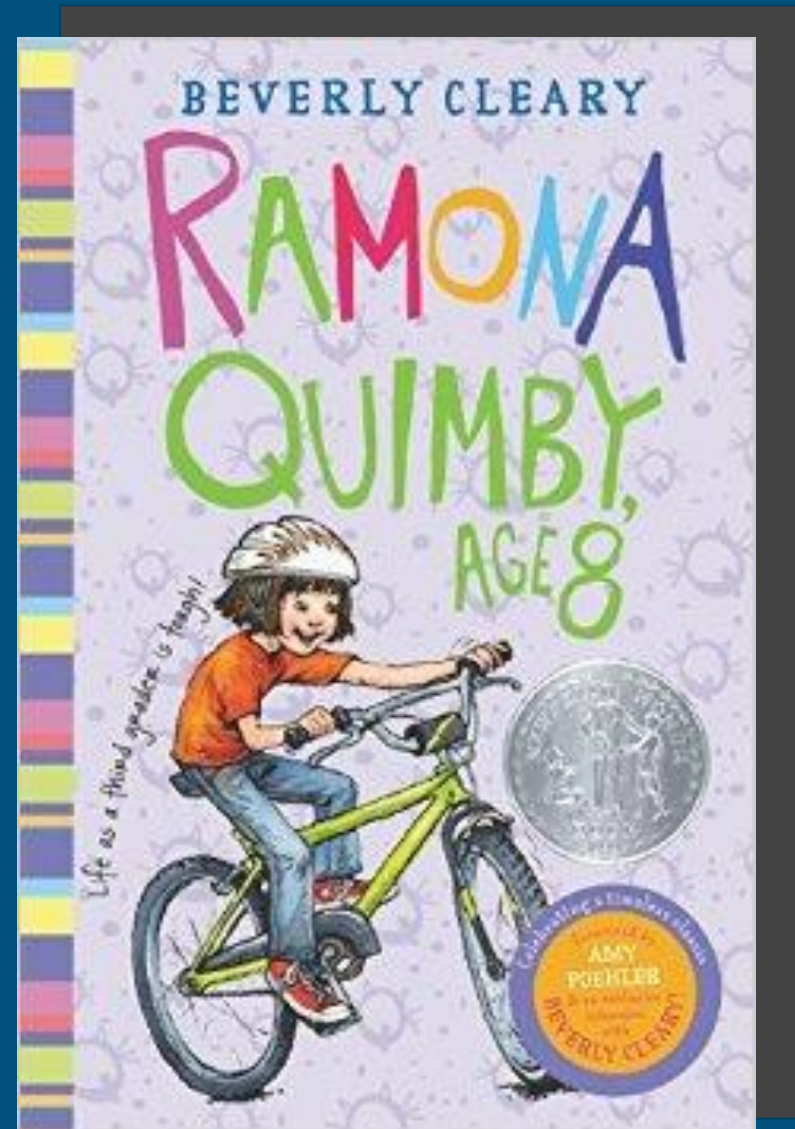


Ramona Quimby, Age 8

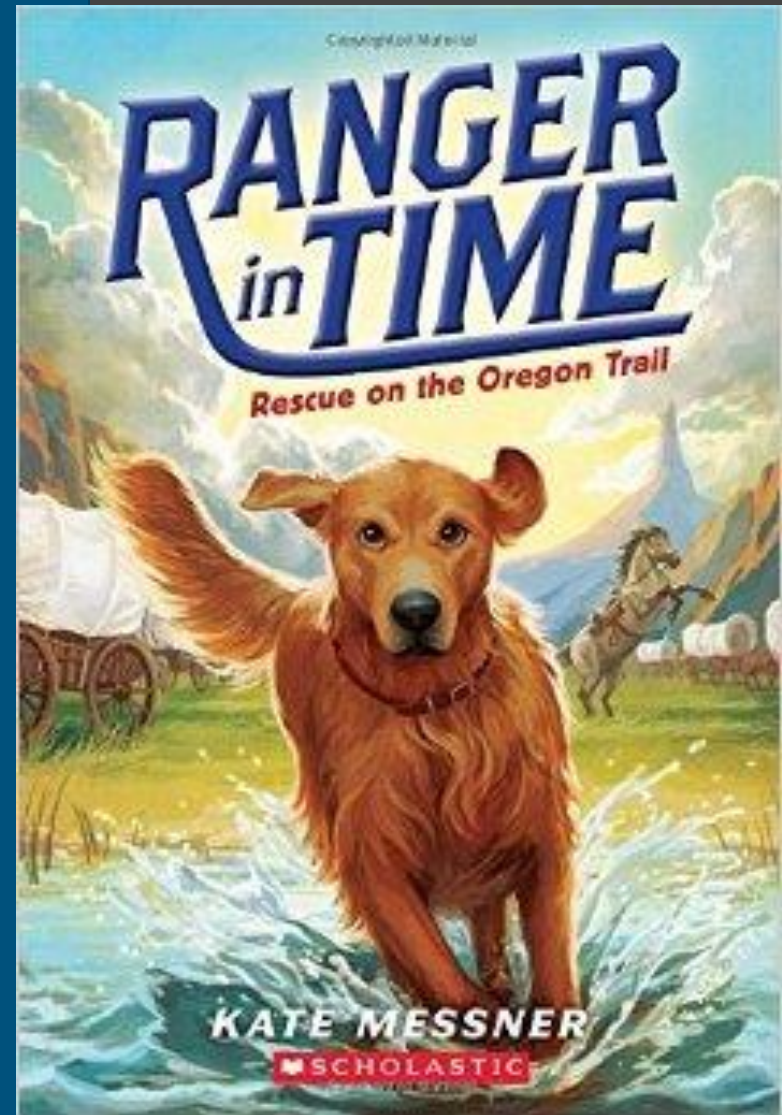

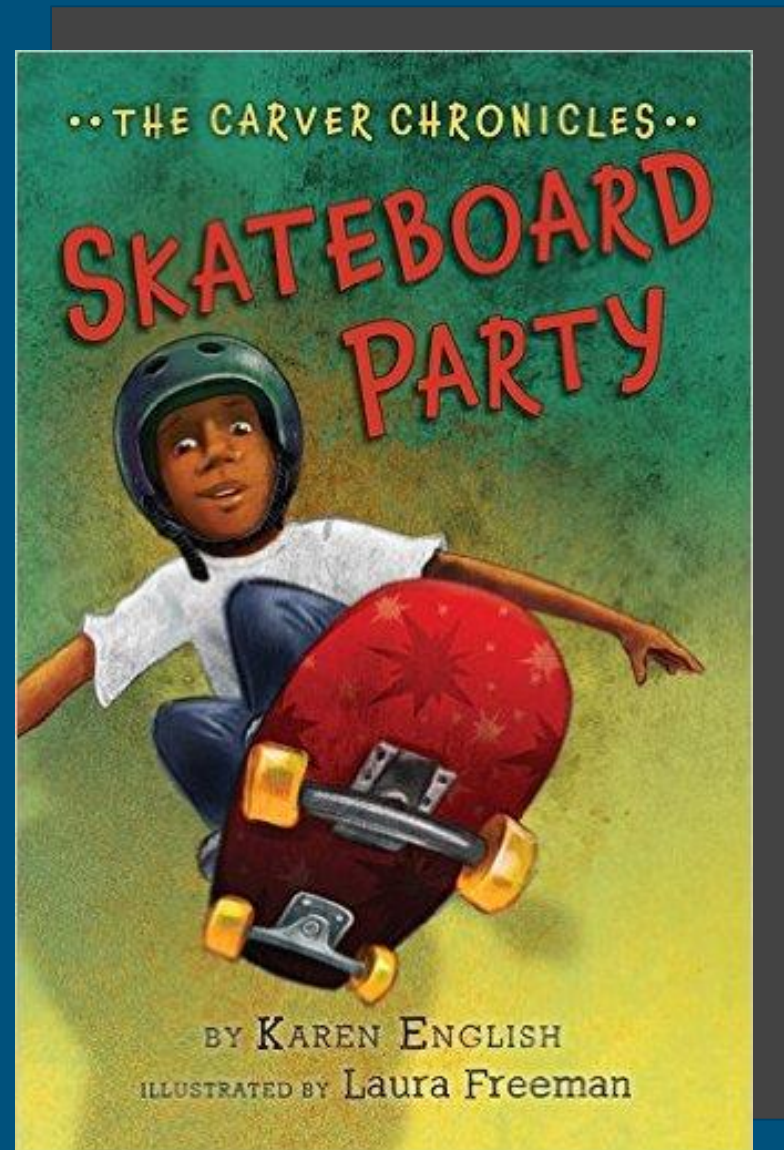
Rescue on the Oregon Trail by Kate Messner

Skateboard Party by Karen English

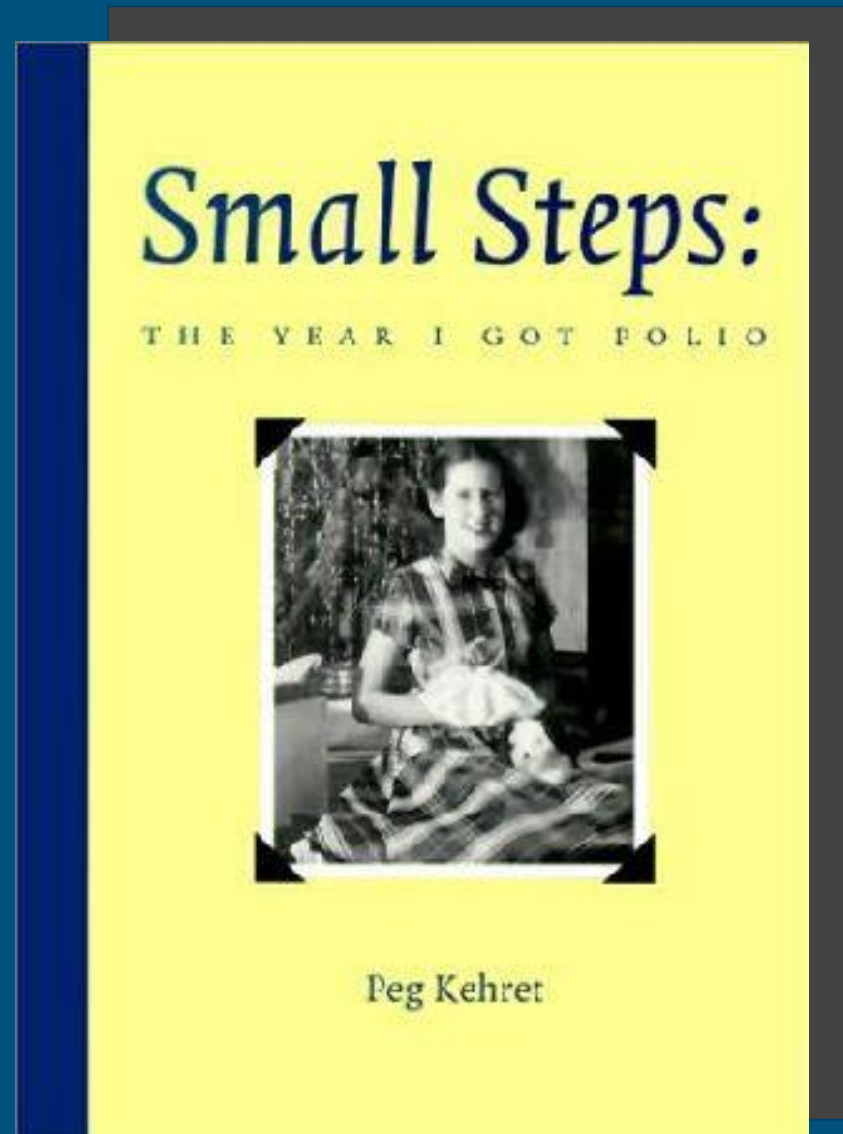

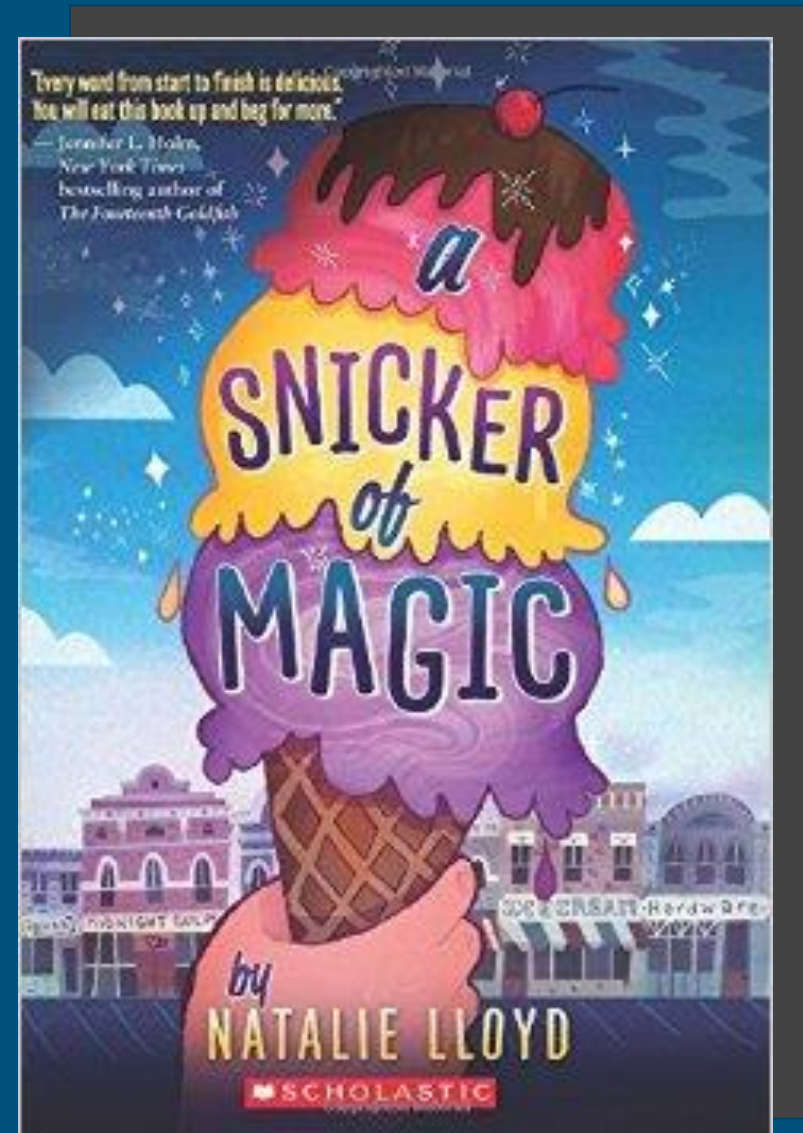

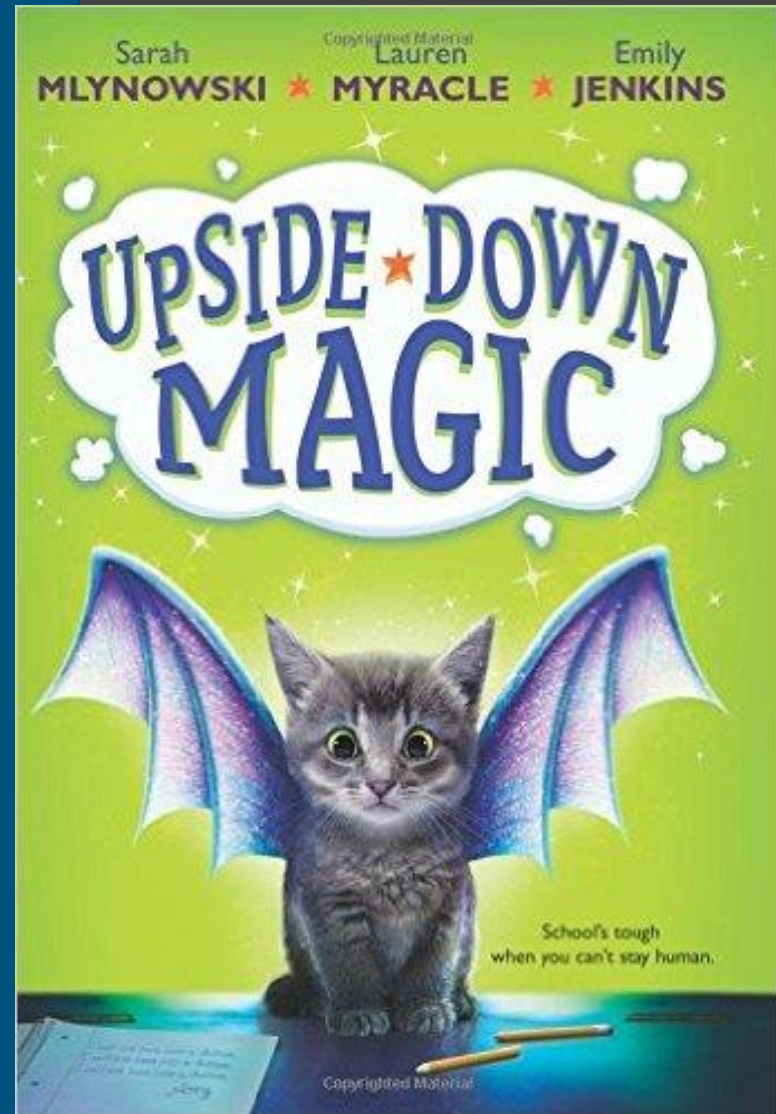
