

#### Because of Mr.Terupt



A class of outcasts, only Mr. Terupt, their new and energetic teacher, seems to know how to deal with them all.




Escaping the Giant Wave by Peg Kehret

# Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone by JK Rowling



### Hook's Revenge by Heidi Schulz



Twelve-year-old Jocelyn dreams of becoming every bit as daring as her infamous father, Captain James Hook




### Joshua Dread by Lee Bacon


### Knucklehead by Jon Scieszka

Scieszka, who grew up as the second of six sons, has written an autobiography for anyone interested in baseball, fire, and peeing on stuff.




### Matilda by Roald Dahl


### Miss Spitfire by Sarah Miller

### Quinny & Hopper by Adriana Brad Schanen



# Ramona Quimby, Age 8 by Beverly Cleary




# Rescue on the Oregon Trail by Kate Messner

Meet Ranger! He's a timetraveling golden retriever who has a nose for trouble . . . and always saves the day!




### Skateboard Party by Karen English

# Small Steps: The Year I Got Polio by Peg Kehret Small Ste




