PAX Good Behavior Game	The PAX Good Behavior Game (GBG) program is a powerful yet simple approach used to create a supportive environment for all students. It is not a curriculum, rather it is a set of evidence-based strategies used to create a positive and productive classroom environment that reflects the culture of your learning community.  PAX GBG is trauma-informed and trauma sensitive practice that teaches children to self-regulate, to work together for common goals, and to practice critical cognitive, emotional, and behavioral skills. The strategies can be used during any classroom or school activity and are easily integrated with restorative practices. Participants will receive a comprehensive PAX curriculum kit and will be supported by a School Climate TOSA and/or school-based school coach. Creating Community with Classroom Management (K-8)	Come learn positive and proactive strategies for creating effective and safe learning communities! Participants will review strategies to structure the classroom for success, explicitly teach classroom expectations, observe student behavior with intention, create motivational systems and respond skillfully to problem behavior. Emphasis will be placed on creating classroom communities that are safe and supportive of all students. Teachers will leave with a completed classroom management plan, and a framework for considering their classroom management strengths and challenges, as well as resources for problem solving. Participants will explore strategies for weaving in culturally relevant community building and restorative practices into their daily routines. Effective Secondary Classrooms	This series will explore various topics relating to culturally responsive classroom communities including classroom organization, developing expectations, corrections, and teacher-student relationship quality. Through the lens of racial equity, participants will consider the link between instruction and behavior. Over three sessions, participants will use various evidenced-based tools and practices to investigate and develop systems for building and maintaining positive classroom communities. Participants will explore an array of proactive and positive strategies, and receive support and feedback as they cultivate inclusive classroom management plans. Initial School Climate Planing with CR-PBIS (K-8)	The process of developing positive school climate includes two significant goals: 1. safety for all and 2. ensuring our historically underserved students are not disproportionately disciplined. This training will give teams an introduction to school climate, the integration of PBIS, restorative justice practices, and equity. Participants will learn how to align the CAP, Action Plan, and School Climate Handbook to develop a positive and proactive school climate that is transparent and sustainable. Person Centered Planning	This workshop is designed to develop Facilitators for Person Centered Planning. Person Centered Planning (PCP) is an ongoing problem-solving process used to help students experiencing challenges with school plan for their future. In PCP, a support group focuses on an individual and that person's vision for the future. This "person-centered" team meets to identify opportunities for the focus person to develop personal relationships, reconnect to school, participate in their community, increase control over their own lives, and develop the skills and abilities needed to achieve these goals. The process is guided by the student.
