





# **Attendance Cluster Model**

Presently, Portland Public Schools has over 17% of their students missing more than 10% of the school year. This means that over 8,000 students are chronically absent which puts them at risk of not reading proficiently by 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and at higher risk of dropping out. With support from partners, the Office of Equity and Partnerships is launching a K-8 cluster-wide attendance effort built on evidencebased practices and lessons learned from the attendance pilot, Every Student, Every Day, Attendance Matters.

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
## Case management services available through a referral process after school based processes have been utilized

**KEY COMPONENTS** 

- Access to resources and referrals to support basic
   needs such as food, clothing, housing and utilities,
   transportation, and physical and mental health
- Convening community partner teams (SIT/SART) to serve highest need students and families

**CLUSTER LEVEL SUPPORT** 

- Cluster-wide incentives and/or recognition
- Network of best practices shared district-wide
- Coordination of school and community services
