There has recently been some unsafe and aggressive behavior between students on the playground after school. This kind of behavior is not safe!

This is a friendly reminder that there is no staff supervision for students after 2:30pm. We ask that all students have an adult with them if they want to play on the playground. Here is a reminder of the rules:

- 1. Students in K-5 who are waiting for older siblings must wait in the library.
- 2. Students in K-8 who walk home should not stay on the playground unsupervised.

- **4**. We have an after school program that provides after school care.

Throughout the year I often field questions from parents about what my job entails and what services I provide as a Professional School Counselor at Astor. During these conversations, I also spend some time exploring some misconception about my position as well. Therefore, for the purpose of clarity and transparency, I would like to share with you the following examples of what I do, and what I do not:

As a School Counselor, I do...

Work with All students to encourage a school climate that reflects our school-wide expectations (be safe, be respectful, and be responsible).

Deliver classroom lessons that align with national school counseling standards.

Facilitate small groups focused on various social-emotional topics.

Meet individually with students to do brief, solution-focused counseling.

Help students who are struggling to make positive behavior choices.

Collaborate with parents/guardians, teachers, support staff, and administration.

Maintain confidentiality of students and their families unless there is a need to know or a safety concern.

Provide information for families about school and community resources.

As a School Counselor, I do not...

Work with only special ed, general ed, or "struggling" students.

Teach academic subjects.

Facilitate therapy groups.

Meet individually with students to do long-term mental health counseling/therapy.

Handle discipline or assign consequences (but I can be part of the repair process or mediation).

Collaborate with only one person (a team approach including the School Counselor works best).

Share information about students and their families to appease the curiosity of others.

Tell teachers how to teach in their classrooms or tell parents how to parent at home.
