# Service Area & Target Groups/Focus

Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

School Population: 443 students; Grades PK-8; 100% Eligible for Free Meals; 84% Students of Color (African American 51%, American Indian/AK Native <1%, Asian 2%, Hispanic 23%, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 5%, Multiple Race 4%, White 16%)

# **Evaluation 2013-14**

# **Outputs**

### 203 youth served

94% students of color

70% identified as being "at risk of academic failure" 87% qualified for free and reduced lunch

#### 71 adults served

**312 people served** in non-enrollment events (family educational nights, cultural fairs, etc.)

# **Outcomes**

**86%** of students increased benchmark scores in Reading **79%** of students increased benchmark scores in Math **Average daily attendance** of SUN CS students was **95%** 

## **SUN Success Story**

Woodlawn School was awarded the SIG grant this year, which allowed more funding to support our students. In particular, Woodlawn SUN was able to put **ALL SUN students** in extended learning with a certified teacher for one hour after school. Students clearly understand their work more and teachers are seeing students turning in homework more consistently and on time.

According to teachers, of students who regularly attended SUN CS:

71% improved classroom academic performance

67% improved getting homework in on time

69% participated in class more

**56%** improved **behavior** 

71% came to school more motivated to learn
