  - \$10,000 per school per year for 5 years, every MS, HS, K-8 (38 PPS schools)
- Schoolyards maintenance & Outdoor Learning (Connection to CCRP Pillar 1 & 3, Goals 1.3.3 and 3.3.3
  - over 60 school learning gardens
  - Partner organizations currently at 14 schools

- \$100k grant from Oregon Dept. of Ed.
- Waste Services & Diversion (connection to CCRP Pillar 1, Goal 1.2.2)
  - Waste Services Contract (Request for Proposal coming in 2025)
  - Container sensors
  - Engagement
- Student Transportation
  - Education & PPS history of low emission, propane vehicles
  - Finding ways to fund \$300,000 electric buses, currently drastically underfunded
    - Always looking for new funding and partners
    - Procurement from First Students, EPA grant
- Strategic Partnerships
  - Team of 4 full time staff, coordinate private and public funds in addition to state funds
  - Fund for Portland Public Schools
  - Public advocacy plays an important role in the investments made in PPS
