TAG Update

The TAG general referral window is now open and will remain open until near the end of the year. Students can be identified in up to three areas: Reading, Math, and Intellectual. An individual student can be identified in either one, two, or all three areas depending on their areas of strength and needs.

Assessment scores are part of what is used to determine eligibility, however, ODE and district guidance are primarily focused on determining if a student needs specific differentiation to be successful.

As part of this focus, the first step of the district process is for you to have a conversation with the classroom teacher to let them know that you are interested in referring your child for TAG. This conversation is also an opportunity for them to share what they are seeing in the classroom currently, what types of differentiation they may already be providing, and what TAG services typically look like in their specific classroom.

What are students learning in Library/Technology?

Most classes in 2nd-5th have been introduced to Typing Club. This is a free app located on the students PPS homepage that walks them through lessons to become more proficient on the keyboard. Make sure they are logged in each time to Typing Club so their progress is saved!



This week, 3rd-5th grade students learned all about the PPS digital library collection on Sora. This is a free app located on their PPS

homepage that gives them access to digital books, audio books and magazines! This increases their reading options by 1,000s!!

Books checkout on Sora are over and above what they can checkout in our Bridlemile library too. This is great news!! If we don't have a book they want or they want to be able to read the same book from home or school- check out Sora! The app is also free to download on personal devices so students can access their account and books from anywhere!


Ida B. Wells Participates in Portland Winter Light Festival
