TAG Nomination forms are now available

If you are interested in nominating your child as TAG, please contact Mr. Stenger at pstenger@pps.net and he will provide you with the link to the digital nomination form.

Please note that due to limitations of distance learning, the timeline and process for TAG identification look a bit different this year. Since standardized tests (state OSAS tests, MAP assessments, and 2nd-grade universal screener) have all been on hold since last March, we currently lack the data required to complete a TAG identification for students in grades K-3. While parents can still begin the identification process for those students, be aware that the process will not be completed until some form of testing is resumed.

For parents of 4th and 5th graders interested in beginning the identification process, it is more likely that the process will be able to be completed this fall/winter provided that your student completed the MAP assessment last winter. Applications for 4th and 5th grade students who did not complete the MAP last year will similarly be in process until standardized testing resumes.

Parent nominations for TAG are due by December 4th.

If you would prefer to complete the verification via paper, please contact the office <u>bridlemile-office@pps.net</u> and we will email you a hardcopy of your student's profile. Please review all the information and write in any necessary changes. Be sure to **sign and date** the paper verification form and return to the office via email or regular mail to the school.

- 2. Advance the calendar to Nov. 23-24 (there is a link at the bottom of the page that will do this automatically)
- 3. Click on the available time slot that you want to claim. Click on save to finalize your sign-up.

IMMUNIZATION FOLLOW-UP

Schools can find their immunization reports for Spring 2020 on the PPS Health Services page under Immunizations: <u>https://www.pps.net/site/default.aspx?PageID=14527</u>. We will update again in Spring 2021.

Immunizations are an important part of keeping our kids and community safe from certain diseases. That is why vaccines are required for school. Click <u>here</u> to see what immunizations are required for your child's grade. Fall is a great time to catch-up on vaccines and get your yearly flu shots. Students need to be up-to-date on vaccines or give the school documentation of an exemption by early January, so that your child is not at risk of being excluded from school. **Exclusion day is February 17, 2021**.

Dear PPS Families,

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been a significant decline in children accessing preventative medical services like vaccines and well child checks. We're happy to announce that we have reopened two of PPS' school-based health centers to provide access to medical services for students while the district continues to hold classes remotely. School-based health centers offer quality, affordable health care by doctors and Family Nurse Practitioners for children and youth with no out of pocket cost.

The opening of the **Benson Wellness Center** will join the **Roosevelt Student Health Center** as the second school-based health center to re-open in PPS. These centers provide students an additional option to access health care aside from their primary care provider and serve students who don't have access to health care.

Benson Wellness Center

- Where: Benson Polytechnic High School, 546 NE 12th
- Serves: All PPS students ages 7 to 21
- **Partners:** Oregon Health Services University, Multnomah County, Multnomah Education Service District
- Services: Regular check-up, sports physical, primary care, immunizations, injury evaluation, mental health and substance use evaluation and treatment, sexual health, other medical questions. The center does not offer COVID-19 testing, but can refer patients to testing sites sponsored by OHSU or Multhomah County.
- If you need care: Call 503-494-8505 to register for first-time patients; call 503-418-0409 to make an appointment, in-person or virtual. Please note that face masks are required during appointments.
