MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL TOWNSEND

Staffing for the 22-23 School Year

Typically, staffing is decided based on current year's enrollment data as well as projected population data. For the past two school years, the school district has 'held schools harmless', which means they have retained staffing based on enrollment numbers from the 19-20 school year. This was done because districts and schools were impacted by the COVID pandemic.

Moving into next school year, the district has to use current enrollment along with projected population measures to determine adequate staffing. Unfortunately, the district has experienced an enrollment decline of 8%. Bridlemile Elementary has had a 9% enrollment decline since the 20-21 school year. In addition, due to the decline in enrollment and the uncertainty of the funds the

Bridlemile Foundation might be able to raise, we are seeing a decrease in staffing that includes the loss of:

- 1 classroom teacher at the 2nd grade level
- 50% technology teacher (foundation funded)
- 50% instructional specialist (foundation funded)
- 50% office staff (foundation funded)

Enrollment numbers are reviewed by the district each June and October and could lead to the reinstatement of some staffing positions.

Graffiti at Bridlemile

In response to the hate speech graffiti on Bridlemile property this past weekend, the Bridlemile Racial Equity Team has provided these updates resulting from collaborations.

Four things emerged when the Bridlemile staff RESJ team met along with discussion with PTA and PTA Equity Committee members: making space for the emotional impact, making restorative actions, reclaiming our Bridlemile space, and continuing the work of antiracism at Bridlemile. The ideas to complement those needs might be met through community efforts (PTA and the Bridlemile Neighborhood Association) and through direct action as a staff.

The RESJ team presented the following direct action for staff to use as one option to be responsive to the hate speech that took place last weekend. Because we have been teaching about identity, race, and antiracism, the onramps for these discussions were already in place.

- 1. A reminder of the power of words: share a grade level appropriate book about the power of words such as: "Each Kindness," "Ouch! moments, When Words are Used in Hurtful Ways" (available on EPIC), "Words are Not for Hurting" (available on EPIC), or a similar book that has been a touchpoint for the class this year.
- 2. An explanation of particularly harmful words called "hate speech:"
 - PPS provided definition: "Hate Speech" means the written, verbal, visual or symbolic expression of animus on the basis of race, color, religion, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, or national origin.
 - Facing Facts: What is Hate Speech? One minute video
 - "Standing Up to Hate Speech" (available on EPIC, older grades)
 - <u>Time for Kids Article</u> to generate conversation on hate speech with students (for grades 3-5)
- **3. Grade level appropriate sharing about what happened over the weekend:** *Our Bridlemile space had hate speech written on the walls of our school and on our playground over the*

weekend. This hate speech used words that mean unkind things about Black people. Words were written that are harmful to everyone, because when one group of people in our community is harmed, it hurts us all. What have you heard about this? What feelings does it bring up? What does it make you want to do?

4. **Opportunity to process and express feelings followed by tangible action** to further process emotionally and feel a sense of empowerment and control.

Engage students in reclaiming our space as No Place for Hate, to send a clear message to one another and to community members that Hate Speech will not be tolerated here.

- What does a healthy, happy community look like?
- How should our Bridlemile community respond to hate speech? What are your ideas?
- We don't know who did the mean writing. If you could say something to that person or persons, what would you say? What would you want them to know?
- How could we communicate to our community our school values of anti-racism, racial equity, social justice, respect, and integrity (include other values students come up with)?
- One idea we have heard: make posters to face outwardly to our community to communicate student voice on these matters,

It is important for students (and adults!) to understand that racism is not a thing of the past, but something that happens in today's world. We <u>all</u> have to work <u>all</u> the time to be anti-racist and to be an upstander. What will you do?
