FROM THE OFFICE

<u>School supply lists</u> for the 2021-2022 school year are now available on our <u>website</u> and also linked <u>HERE</u>. There are many options for parents purchasing school supplies:

- Visit your local big box store and pick out your student's own supplies.
- Shop online (if you use Amazon remember Bridlemile PTA is a registered charity with Amazon Smile and the Bridlemile PTA will get a percentage of every sale).
- Purchase an assembled kit from <u>Schoolhouse Supplies</u> and your student's supplies will be delivered to Bridlemile over the summer and arrive at their desk for the first day of school.
- If your student will be in need of School Supplies for the 2021-2022 school year, please contact our Bridlemile counselors, Rachel Reich at rreich@pps.net or Jamie Laungenour at jlaungenour@pps.net. Let us know your student(s) name and what grade they will be enrolled in as of fall 2021. Our counselors will be keeping a list of students who have requested school supplies and will arrange to have supplies delivered to student's classrooms at the start of the school year.

If you would like to **donate** school supplies or a school supply kit to a Bridlemile student, you can either:

Purchase additional supplies when you visit your local big box store/shop online,

- Purchase an assembled kit from <u>Schoolhouse Supplies</u> and in the field for the students name, enter "PRINCIPALS KIT", or
- Donate directly to the Bridlemile School "<u>School Supply Fund</u>" via SchoolPay. All
 contributions will go towards supplies for students in need.

Over the last 43 years, Young Audiences Run/Fun for the Arts has helped schools secure nearly \$18 million dollars for arts experiences and has become an established Northwest tradition. One of the most exciting parts of this tradition is the yearly student-designed T-shirt and printed materials.

Your student's artwork could be featured on thousands of shirts, posters and sponsor sheets.

Designs should incorporate themes and images relating to Young Audiences Fun for the Arts, including a variety of art forms (theater, music, dance, etc.), physical activity, and community.

- Submissions for the 2021–2022 school year are due **June 11, 2021** and may be mailed to our office or emailed to koko@ya-or.org.
- All K-12 students in Oregon and SW Washington are eligible to submit a design.
- Finalists will be announced on Young Audiences' social media platforms.
- One winner will receive a prize of \$350, their design on T-shirts, posters and promotional materials, and the chance to work with a real graphic designer.

Library Connect and PPS--check this out!

Your student now has access to resources provided by Multnomah County Public Library through his or her Library Connect username and password. This means that if your child lost his or her library card or hasn't memorized the library barcode number, you have nothing to

worry about! Simply use the Library Connect login id and password and you are good to go! Everything has already been set up for your student. There is nothing you need to do but know the login number and password. The login number is 01+student ID number. Password is your child's birthdate, month, day, year (8 digits). If your child already has a password associated with his or her library card, then the password wasn't changed. Read the attached flier for more information. FLAG: First practice will be the week of August 9th. 3/4th graders will practice 2-3 nights through October and K-2nd graders practice 1-2 nights a week. K-2 will go for about an hour, 3/4th graders will go about 1.5-2 hours depending on what the coach thinks.

Games will start the Saturday after Labor Day and run every Saturday through October.

TACKLE: Equipment pick up will be Sunday August 1st and August 8th in the afternoon. This is an important time to be there and get properly fitted. New players will want to wear their gear and get used to it before the season starts.

Conditioning week starts Monday, August 9th. For 5-8th grade tackle they need 10 hours of conditioning before they can practice in pads.

Practice for Tackle will be 4-5 nights a week in August and will go down to 3 nights a week in September-October.

There will be a tackle jamboree for all teams on Saturday August 28th and the regular season starts the Saturday after Labor day and games are every Saturday through October.
