MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL HU

Dear Bridlemile Families,

This was the first week of school with our youngest beagles! We welcome our Kindergarten students and their families. Everyone is doing a great job learning new routines and developing new friendships!

We want to thank all families for their continued support and efforts for timely student arrival. Class starts at 8:00am, which means teaching and learning begin at this time. We encourage students to arrive in time for doors opening at 7:52.

Safety is our highest priority. Our perimeter doors are closed and locked during the day. During student arrival, once teachers and students head inside, the doors are closed and we ask students arriving after doors are closed to head to the main doors for entry. Our two main doors have external cameras that show us in the main office who is ringing the buzzer. These cameras are recorded in case the footage needs to be reviewed. We continue to ask that if you are ringing in to the main entrance, that you do not hold the door open for someone waiting to enter behind you. It's best when visitors can be identified at the door first.

We conduct monthly fire drills to practice exiting the building safely, quickly, and in an organized manner. We practiced our first fire drill this morning. Students did a great job being safe and responsible. We are also required to practice other drills throughout the school year that include earthquake and lockdown preparedness. Later this month, we will practice the lockdown drill. Our staff will review protocol with students, have an age-appropriate discussion about the reasons for the

drill, and discuss expectations for what happens before, during, and after the drill. Your child may come home with questions. Information for how to discuss the drill is <u>linked here.</u>

Max Krieger (Garden Educator, He/Him) comes to Grow Portland with 15 years of experience working with young people outside. He began this work in upstate New York in the field of wilderness therapy. After moving to Oregon in 2011, he led courses with NOLS, an international wilderness school, that focused on leadership, risk management, environmental studies, and outdoor skills. Max began his journey with garden education while receiving his MS in Sustainability Education from Portland State University in 2017. Since then he has become passionate about the power of gardens to help people foster connections to the natural world and to each other. Most recently, Max managed a garden for a Sandy area nonprofit that

engaged youth in workforce development. Max has fallen in love with the Pacific Northwest and while he plans to continue planting roots in this region, he will always be a Georgia peach at heart.
