Comprehensive Distance Learning Extended

Our Superintendent announced at last week's school board meeting that Comprehensive Distance Learning will continue through at least January 28. While in-person instruction is what we were all hoping for, our county and state metrics for COVID are too high to go back into the building. Doing so would pose a health and safety for our students, staff, and families.

Participation during CDL is Important!

This year, the Oregon Department of Education has provided guidelines that require learning activities throughout the school day (unlike what we experienced last spring). Schools must take attendance and give grades to students during Comprehensive Distance Learning. If your child participates during a school day in some way, they are counted present. However, attendance is just the first step! It is critical that your child not only participates in class meetings but also completes class work while we are learning online. While class meetings offer opportunities for students to stay connected to the school community

and learn directly with their teacher, it is really important for students to engage in academics. No matter what types of assignments students complete, doing class work helps to ensure that your child is not falling behind during this very unusual time. It is also important that your child attends the synchronous art and PE classes because our Specials Teachers are also required to give grades to students.

Additionally, two programs, Lexia and Dreambox, are able to provide teachers with valuable data which allows them to place students in groups based on their strengths and needs. Please have your child work on these programs when they are assigned. Please have your child complete the work on these programs without help so teachers have an accurate measure of their skill levels.

We have heard from a number of families that the school work assigned can be overwhelming. Teachers have been asked to prioritize learning activities so that students are participating in the most critical experiences and may skip optional assignments. We hope this will make the distance learning experience more manageable for everyone and offer a way that all of our students are able to show their teachers how they are learning and growing this fall.

Conferences and Report Cards

Quarter 1 of this school year ends in the beginning of November. Conferences typically take place on November 23 and 24. Teachers will be completing conference forms and scheduling conferences with each family soon. As always, conferences take the place of the formal report card during Quarter 1. Report cards will be available in ParentVue at the end of Quarters 2, 3, and 4.

When your student is going to miss class and will be marked absent, please include Heidi (hreichel@pps.net) and Mike (meskew@pps.net) in your communications to the teacher. Heidi and Mike are the ones that can mark your student with an excused absence.

3. \$1,000-\$3,000 Grants Available for Black Families: Oregon Cares Fund for Black Relief & Resiliency

The Oregon Cares Fund provides Black individuals, families, businesses and non-profits experiencing adverse effects from the COVID-19 pandemic with cash grants. The Black community is at the front of two pandemics: COVID-19 and systemic racism. Well before the health crisis began, Black Oregonians and Black business owners were far behind white Oregonians in education, health, and economic prosperity. LatinX Heritage Month


September 15th through October 15th is LatinX Heritage Month!
