2. Choose 8 classes that meet grad requirements and reflects your post-secondary education goals.
3. Remember: Course offerings and staffing decisions are based upon student forecasting.
4. Schedule changes are DIFFICULT and sometimes not possible. Please make your choices thoughtfully including your alternatives...

- \* These classes offer an option for you to challenge yourself and get college credit in high school!

# AP Classes

- \* Selecting an AP course means that you intend to complete the entire school year in that AP course
- \*
- \* Acquisition of a 3 or higher on the AP exam exempts students from similar classes in college, saving \$\$\$
- \* There are supports for AP students:
  1. The Tutoring Center in Library after school (open to all)
  2. Help sessions provided by individual teachers

# FORECASTING – CHOOSING YOUR CLASSES

1. Fill out top of forecast form: name, ID #, contact information in case we need to reach you to make changes etc.
2. Follow along as we talk about your options, ask questions. Circle the classes you are interested in.
3. Choose classes (use pencil).
4. Write the number of classes you actually want on the front side
5. Talk to parent/guardian and have them sign and go to Student Vue and start adding these classes online into your account.
6. Bring your forms to your English class next week and counselors will meet with you one on one to lock your classes.



# Choosing Your Classes: Seniors

- You will choose 8 classes: Seniors must have a minimum of 6 classes next year per district mandate
- Choose English (p.39) and an alternative option
- Choose Gov/Econ or AP Gov/Econ (Constitutional Law)
- Math Highly Recommended for all (p. 48)
- The remaining classes are electives

# Choosing a Math class

## Math:

- \* Choose the next level of math. Your current math teacher can make recommendations.
- \* NO repeats of Algebra 1-2 or Geometry 1-2. See counselor for summer school/night school
- \* Consult the Math class Decision Tree for guidance.

# Choosing World Language

2 years of the same language is required to graduate! We offer 5 different world languages:

Spanish

French

German

Chinese Mandarin

Russian

We recommend you stick with the same language you are taking right now.

If you have already fulfilled your language requirement, and you choose to take a 3<sup>rd</sup> year or beyond, (which we encourage!) make this choice carefully, as you will not be allowed to make changes, including dropping this class!

# Career Pathways Electives

**Health Services:** Sports Medicine, Anat/Phys, Med Term, AP Chemistry, AP Statistic, ect.

**Business and Management:** Intro Business/Marketing, Personal Finance, Student Store, Accounting, Print Shop Internship, ect,

**Arts/ Music/Communication:** All Art classes, Ceramic, Photo, Theaters, Video Production, Journalism, Performance art classes, ect.

# Career Pathway Elective (continue)

**Industrial and Engineering Technology:** Computer Apps, Coding 1-4, Industrial Tech, Robotics 1-4, AP Physics 1-2, Adv Sciences, Adv Maths, ect.

**Natural Resources, Foods and Agriculture:** Marine Science, Environmental Science classes, Culinary Arts

**Public and Human Services:** Intro to Education, Intro to Psychology, AP Psychology, Intro to Law and Mock Trial, Leadership, ect.

# Reminders

- ❖ Pass all courses with a “D” or better.
- ❖ Most 4-year universities expect a “C” or better in the 14 core credits to gain admission.
- ❖ Students who fail a course must retake the class!!
- ❖ Students who fail must see their counselor to make a plan to retrieve the credit. Students are not permitted to retake failed courses at FHS.
- ❖ Students have a variety of options. These all cost \$, between \$35- \$200 per 0.5 credit class.
