#### **Attention 4th Grade Families:**

As you are planning your spring break and summer vacations, remember that **all 4th graders are eligible for a free national park pass.** To help engage and create our next generation of park visitors, supporters and advocates, Federal Land Management agencies, launched the Every Kid in a Park initiative. The immediate goal is to provide an opportunity for each and every 4th grade student across the country to experience their federal public lands and waters in person throughout the school year. Every year, beginning September 1, all kids in the fourth grade have access to their own Every Kid in a Park pass at <a href="www.everykidinapark.gov">www.everykidinapark.gov</a>. This pass provides free access to national parks across the country and is good for the 4th grade school year, until August 31, 2019.

#### Dear Grout Community,

On February 9th and 10th, 2020, community members are invited to attend Community Feedback Sessions on PPS Enrollment Policies under review. As Portland Public Schools focuses on orienting our school system towards providing every student with an equitable, inspired, intellectually rigorous educational experience, the Board of Education and the Superintendent will launch an enrollment and program balancing process to optimize the use of facilities within the school district while supporting our efforts to reimagine the school experience for students - particularly at the middle grades. During this process, beginning in the spring, staff will develop recommendations for enrollment and program balancing in Portland Public Schools based on identified goals.

Why is PPS facilitating an enrollment balancing process?

- 1. To help support the eventual Redesign of PPS Middle School programs that includes reconfiguration of identified K-8 neighborhood schools to K-5 elementary schools and 6-8 new comprehensive middle schools while maintaining regional K-8 school options to support program pathway continuity (for example: IB PYP to MYP and dual immersion language pathways).
- 2. Optimize Use of Facilities at PK-12 to address under-enrollment and over enrollment, and to begin phasing out portable classrooms when possible to create connected, safer schools.
- 3. Minimize Program Co-Locations of facilities between co-located programs and neighborhood schools at K-5, K-8 and 6-8 schools

#### **Prior to the Process:**

Prior to beginning this process in the spring, PPS will review enrollment and student assignment policies to infuse a lens of racial equity & social justice, and review the legacy "sibling preference" rule after hearing reflections from the community. During the month of February, focus groups, public sessions, and scheduled Board of Education Policy Committee Meetings are opportunities for interested stakeholders to provide feedback in the process.
