We are now at the end of the 2018-19 school year and this is our last newsletter of the year. To me it has been an amazing year and I hope it has been an enjoyable and successful year for you and your children.

Looking back, it seems like yesterday that I met many of you for the first time at the "Meet and Greet" in August in our school cafeteria. I had recently arrived from my journey north from Oakland, California and I was experiencing my first summer in Portland. I felt very fortunate to be named Principal of James John as I met a group of friendly, intelligent students and a group of passionate and caring parents. In addition, as I met our teachers and staff, I recognized

James John had a talented, dedicated group of educators many of whom had been serving the St. John's community for decades.

As the school year began, we began the year focused on creating and maintaining a positive school climate as well as delivering a challenging academic curriculum. We worked as a staff to understand and implement a new assessment system in Reading and Math (MAPS Assessments) to deliver to teachers, students and parents detailed information on student progress. We also continued our use of a new Language Arts curriculum (Lucy Caulkins Units of Study) which provided students

with differentiated instruction improving their reading and writing skills.

We also worked to increase family involvement and to increase engagement by all the diverse communities of the school. In November, led by our PTA and our "Padres Latinos" we held our first celebration of "Dia de los Muertos" and in February we held a successful Multi-Cultural Night. In January, thanks to the amazing efforts of the PTA and many local donors, we were able to open our new playground in our lower grade yard.

Finally, as has been mentioned many times already, in March and April we were so proud to celebrate the victories of the "Rose City Readers" in the Oregon Battle of the Books (OBOB) competitions. As a small elementary school in North Portland prevailing over all of the elementary schools

in the state, this was a huge accomplishment.

Now that we are at the end of this school year, I want to appreciate all of you for helping make this a successful year at James John. James John has been a successful, stable school for many years and you all have helped me to fulfill the potential of our great school. I am looking forward to serving you all next year as we continue to soar even higher! I hope you all enjoy a restful, enjoyable summer and are able to spend quality time together. To our 5<sup>th</sup> grade families who will be moving on from James John, I wish you all the best and remember that you will always be a part of the James John family.
